ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Ps 95: 6-7

O come, let us worship God
and bow low before the God
who made us, for he is
the Lord our God.

READING I: Is 6:1-2A, 3-8

"The year that king Uzziah
(pictured above) died" is a
reference point for Isaiah
describing the vision in which he
sees the heavenly court.
In the vision, Isaiah experiences
the divine call and responds to it:
"Here I am; send me."

PSALM RESPONSE: Ps 138

This expression of thanks for a
particular favor will be proclaimed
before all creation: the angels and
those assembled in the temple.
The first Hebrew term, translated
as "faithfulness" is often rendered
as "steadfast love". God's
commitment is unswerving and
enduring. One can see why the
two terms occur here as a pair: to
emphasize the utter reliability of
God as one who answers prayer.

READING II: 1 COR 15:1-11

Having taught the Corinthians
that they should live in unity,
despite their diversity, Paul now
summarizes his teaching about
Jesus. He also mentions his own
call to ministry, often referred to
as his conversion.

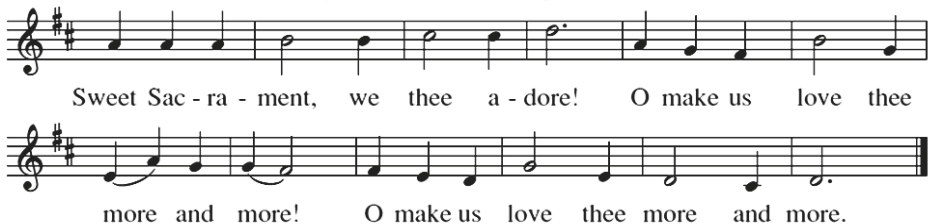
