

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's first reading, Eli encouraged Samuel to say, "Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening". (1 Samuel 3) These are powerful words. To listen to the Lord's voice implies that there is an openness to what He has to say. It requires a readiness to respond…like the servants at the wedding feast of Cana…"do whatever He tells you to do".

In the Responsory Psalm, we heard, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will". If we are listening to the voice of the Lord, He will often reveal His will for our lives...His purpose...His plan. Sometimes, this can be difficult to hear. Sometimes it requires letting go of our plans...our ideas...our way of seeing life.

In the Gospel, we hear an account of John the Baptist pointing two of his disciples to Jesus. "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. They responded to the call of the Lord and followed Him. One of the disciples, Andrew, went and told his brother, Simon, about Jesus. Then Simon chose to follow Jesus as well and became the Apostle, Peter.

This dynamic is at the heart of our Christian faith. Prayer opens us up to have a disposition of listening to the voice of the Lord. He calls us by name to follow Him. We respond to the call and freely choose to follow Him. We grow as His disciples. He sends us forth as joyful missionary disciples to lead others into an encounter with Him.

Friends, this dynamic is at the heart of Archbishop Vigneron's Pastoral Letter, *Unleash the Gospel*. It is also the dynamic at the heart of our move to become a family of parishes. Together, we can more effectively respond to the call of Jesus to come and follow Him. Together, we can more effectively respond to the call to be sent out as joyful missionary disciples to lead others to follow Him.

Let us pray for an open disposition to want to encounter Jesus more and more so that we will grow in a stronger desire to want to lead others into this same encounter.

# SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

(January 16/17, 2021)

Today's Scripture passages from the First Book of Samuel and St. John's Gospel express the common topic of accepting God's will by responding to His call. Our vocation is the Lord's plan for our lives. St. Paul, in his First Letter to the Corinthian community, professes we are all members of the Body of Christ and temples of the Holy Spirit, that you are not your own. For you have been purchased at a price. Further in First Corinthians, Paul indicates that through the power of the Holy Spirit, we may be given special spiritual gifts — unique gifts which we use to serve the Lord and carry out His divine plan. These gifts in turn, can lead to prayer, meditation, and contemplation — to conversion of mind to heart, and help the discerning steward discover his or her vocational call from the Lord. This call may be to the priesthood or religious life, marriage, the permanent diaconate, or single life. Are we, like Eli, Samuel, or the Apostles, Peter, John, and Andrew, open to the Lord's prompting in our lives? # You are invited to participate In the Sacraments at home!

If you are homebound (due to COVID or other reasons) and would like to receive Holy Communion, Reconciliation or Sacrament of the Sick, we are just a call away. We know that it is hard not being able to attend church on a regular basis. We are in the process of organizing a homebound ministries program for our parishioners. Father and/or the Eucharistic Ministers who come to your home, would of course, wear a mask, sanitize hands before contact and practice social distancing to the extent possible. They would be screened for COVID in terms of not having symptoms, not having recently traveled out of the area, not having been diagnosed with COVID or had recent significant contact with someone who has. In most cases, we would provide the service on your porch or at your door but could, come in if that was more appropriate for your situation.

Pease call the parish office 313-531-0140 to arrange for this service. Someone will call you regarding your needs and scheduling preferences. We will not be able to come to a home where a household member has been diagnosed with COVID and has not had a subsequent negative test or is quarantining due to a recent contact
