Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the Acts of the Apostles, Luke reports that Jesus spoke the following words before he ascended into heaven, ***“In a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you.”*** (Acts chapter 1) This promise was fulfilled on Pentecost. The Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles and disciples in the upper room. They were sent out empowered by God.

This same promise is fulfilled in the Church today. All the Baptized have received the gifts and the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit has come upon us. SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

(MAY 15/16 , 2021)

(When the Ascension is not celebrated on Sunday)

In St. John’s First Letter, he reminds us of our Lord’s love for us, and that in turn, *we must also love one another*. In St. John’s Gospel, Jesus asks His Father to protect and strengthen His disciples as He encourages them to go forth into the world to preach and spread God’s consecrated Word of Truth. In a spirit of evangelization, Jesus prays for acceptance of the Good News His followers will proclaim, and that those they convert will also believe in Him. Jesus’ dialogue with the Father exemplifies that prayer is fundamental to Christian stewardship — we express our gratitude for God’s gifts and our love of God and neighbor through prayer. Creating time for prayer is vitally important for those seeking a personal relationship with our Lord and Savior. The modern-day Italian saint, St. Padre Pio, said it well: *Prayer is the oxygen for the soul*. Begin today a positive habit of setting aside at least three to five minutes for daily prayer; you will discover your prayer time will grow.
