

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On Friday, the Church celebrated the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is celebrated annually on the Friday after the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. At the center of this celebration is the incredible love of God. Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque over a period of time and encouraged her to promote the devotion. He made the following promises to souls devoted to His Sacred Heart.

- “I will give them all the graces necessary for their state in life”
- “I will give peace in their families”
- “I will console them in all their troubles”
- “I will be their refuge in life and especially in death”
- “I will abundantly bless all their undertakings”
- “Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy”
- “Tepid souls shall become fervent”
- “Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection”
- “I will bless those places wherein the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated”
- “I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts”
- “Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in My Heart”
- “In the excess of the mercy of my Heart, I promise you that My all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the Sacraments, and My Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour”

These are immensely powerful promises. Jesus is inviting us to surrender everything to Him so that He can give us the grace to imitate His love and mercy. There is one concrete way we can entrust ourselves to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on a daily basis. It is called the morning offering.

***O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary,
I offer you my prayers, works, joys, and
sufferings of this day
for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart,
in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass
throughout the world,
for the salvation of souls, the reparation of sins,
the reunion of all Christians,
and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father
this month.***

Amen.

This is a simple prayer. If it is genuinely prayed with a humble and sincere heart, it is also a very powerful prayer! Our whole day becomes one continuous prayer to Jesus, and through Him to the Father in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.



STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

THE ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

(JUNE 12/13 , 2021)

In today's Scripture reading from the Prophet Ezekiel, God tends to the trees to provide protection and a dwelling place for the birds. This Old Testament passage is connected to the story of the mustard seed proclaimed in St. Mark's Gospel. Jesus describes how the smallest of seeds on earth produces a plant large enough for birds to dwell in it. At our Baptism, Jesus invites us to be His disciples. The seed is planted. If we open our hearts to this invitation, we can develop a personal relationship with Christ — He becomes the center of our lives. Discipleship increases our faith in Jesus and grows abundantly when nurtured through the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, prayer, the Word of God, and love of neighbor. In a spirit of evangelization, our joy in Jesus overflows when we share it with those we meet. Father in Heaven, renew your wonders in our time, as though by a New Pentecost.


