Thoughts from Fr. Jim—

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

As I drive throughout metro Detroit, I see signs everywhere for farmers markets. It seems like locally grown produce is becoming a popular pastime. Last spring, one of our Companions of the Cross seminarians planted a variety of vegetable plants at our new house located across from Gesu Parish. A priest living with us made the observation that the seminarian was going to leave for the summer and the garden would become overgrown by weeds. Sure enough, he was right. Out of sight, out of mind. The weeds took over the garden. The vegetable plants were choked out. Eventually, we had to take a weed wacker and cut everything down to the ground. There was no produce to be enjoyed.

This year, I decided to cultivate a vegetable garden myself in the same location. I began by thoroughly tilling the soil, putting down a weed barrier, planting a variety of vegetable plants, watering daily, and fertilizing the soil. The plants are flourishing! We are almost ready to enjoy the fruits of my labor! There are some weeds, but fortunately, the weed barrier has prevented the weeds from taking over the garden. As they get large enough, it becomes quite clear that they are weeds, and not vegetable plants. It also becomes much easier to pull them out than when they are very small.

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the weeds and the wheat growing up in the same garden. He warns against pulling out the weeds too early before harvest time. Why would one want to allow the weeds to remain until harvest? From my experience gained from gardening this summer, I can think of a few reasons. Sometimes the wheat can accidentally be pulled up with the weeds. Sometimes wheat can be accidentally mistaken as a weed. Sometimes a weed can be accidentally mistaken as wheat. All of these can cause harm to the final goal of producing a bountiful harvest.

In the spiritual life, this analogy can be applied to us. In every community, there are weeds and wheat interacting with one another. It is not always obvious which people are weeds, and which people are wheat. To eliminate everyone who appears to be a weed might mean accidentally getting rid of wheat. Similarly, sometimes a weed can become wheat through a life-changing encounter with Jesus Christ. We must allow God to remove the weeds within our own hearts so that through our life-changing encounters with Christ, we can all become healthy wheat producing an abundant harvest. Our thematic goal as a parish this year is to *lead all into* a life-changing encounter with Jesus Christ in the **Eucharist**. As we enter this parish year of the National Eucharistic Revival, it is my prayer that each one of us will be open to intentional, life-changing encounters with Jesus in the Eucharist ourselves. May the garden of St. Scholastica Parish produce an abundant harvest in Northwest Detroit. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.


