

# FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

God does not act as we act. In last week's Gospel, the sower threw seed everywhere, generously and with abandon. It did not matter to the sower whether the seed fell on rocky ground, the pathway or places filled with weeds. He simply sowed the seed and waited. We all know what will happen. The seed on rocky ground springs up but has no roots, so it withers. The seed thrown on the pathway is trampled on or eaten by birds. The seed thrown amidst the weeds is choked by them as it grows up. Only the seed sown on good soil prospers and yields a good harvest. So why does the sower (God) do things this way?

The parable is an example of the Word of God and the world. God is generous. God loves and can't help but overflow with love and hope for the whole world. Even when God's love is ignored or unwelcome, God cannot hold back. Thus the seed of God is constantly scattered throughout the world on good and bad alike. Some receive it, some are shallow and give up, others are distracted by evil and the love of God is choked out of them. The point of the parable is that it is OUR reception, OUR decisions which affect how God's love is received and grows in the world. We are the ones who are either the fertile ground or one of the unwelcoming and unhealthy grounds which destroys the Word.

This weekend, Jesus, once again, proposes a number of parables. The first concerns the wheat and the weeds. Here, the farmer plants good seed in good soil only, but the enemy comes and throws weeds into the mix. We, again, would take the weeds out, even if that meant sacrificing some of the good wheat. God, however, is patient. God waits until the harvest to separate good from bad.

What do we learn about God and us from these parables? God is abundantly generous, like a fantastic grandmother (think of cookies and treats and warm, loving laps with stories) overflowing with love! God wants everyone to receive His love. He continues to give, even and when it is rejected. God is also patient. God waits until the harvest, maybe even hoping against hope that some of the weeds will change their ways before the end.

We need to be more like God – giving without counting the cost, offering blessings and love to those who don't deserve it, being patient with others and hoping that one day they will come to see the goodness and light that surrounds them. If we acted this way, our world would be transformed. Thus, Jesus teaches us about the Kingdom of God.
