



FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we have the unusual privilege of celebrating the Feast of the Transfiguration on a Sunday. This only happens every few years and so the readings for the celebration will be unique to those who cannot come to daily Mass and who may have experienced this Feast on a weekday. The first reading is an apocalyptic one from the Book of Daniel. It describes the end of time when the "Son of Man" will return on his throne and permanently establish his reign. Of course, thousands of years later, the first disciples of Jesus came to know Him as the Son of Man. It is an ancient messianic title. This realization, however, did not happen immediately. The disciples, the apostles and the others who walk with Jesus, hear His teachings and experience His miracles are slow to know and understand. Even today, in the Transfiguration, the three apostles are still not certain what has happened to them. They do not understand who the Messiah is and what He is supposed to do. Their earthly and human view is very different than the heavenly and godly view of who the Messiah is. Jesus does not fit into their preconceptions. This is partially why He tells them not to tell anyone until the "Son of Man has been raised from the dead." Only after the resurrection will the followers **begin** to grasp the full import of Jesus and His mission.

Today many people do not believe Jesus is God's Son. Even if He were to appear and God the Father would declare again, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him," there would be many who would think it was their imagination or be too distracted by the ways of the world to recognize Jesus for who He is. Our parables over the last several weeks have told us about seed, good soil and bad, and how just a little yeast or a tiny seed can make a difference. We are that little bit of yeast or that tiny seed and our practice of our faith, our prayer and our witness can make a difference. It is our job to introduce Jesus to the world around us, especially our friends and family who have fallen away.

RCIA Come and See Sessions


