FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today, we hear two of our Catholic beliefs outlined in the Gospel by Jesus. Simon is renamed Peter because of his confession of faith in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the Living God. He names him Peter or "Rock", because he is the new foundation stone on which the church will be built. When people ask where the Pope gets his authority or how did the Catholic Church even come up with its system of leadership and authority, you may easily point to the Gospels, specifically Matthew 16 today, to show Jesus' intention. Secondly Jesus gives Peter the power to forgive sins. What is forgiven on earth is forgiven in heaven and what is retained on earth is retained by God. The wording could not be any clearer. That same authority and privilege is passed down to priests and bishops as a Sacrament of healing.

This is a good weekend, then, to ask ourselves how often we make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) in our lives. God offers us a free gift of healing. People pay a lot of money to go to counseling and to seek mentoring. While these are both worthwhile and necessary, Jesus also offers us healing through the forgiveness of our sins in confession. This Sacrament, this experience, is FREE! Take God at His word. Autumn is a good time to get our life back in order if we have fallen out of order over the summer or become a little lax.





THE BURIAL OF ASHES: The Archdiocese of Baltimore provides a final resting place for those who are cremated but not buried. Since cremation has become a more accepted practice, more families are choosing cremation though many are not choosing burial at the time of cre-

mation. As years and decades pass, the next generation inherit the urns of their grand-parents and great grandparents, increasing the incidents of the urns being misplaced and forgotten. The ministry is also for the recently deceased. The *Ministry of the 14th Station of the Cross* buries the deceased in sacred ground allowing the deceased to rest in peace. There is a minimal fee of \$350 for the burial. The burial occurs annually in November (Month of All Souls). The urns are placed in one vault and buried. This opportunity also provides families peace of mind, as they now know where their family member is perpetually buried. The burial is at Holy Cross Cemetery in Anne Arundel County.

Pastoral visitors will arrange to take custody of the child and secure the child until burial. If the child is born at a hospital, arrangements with the hospital will occur.
