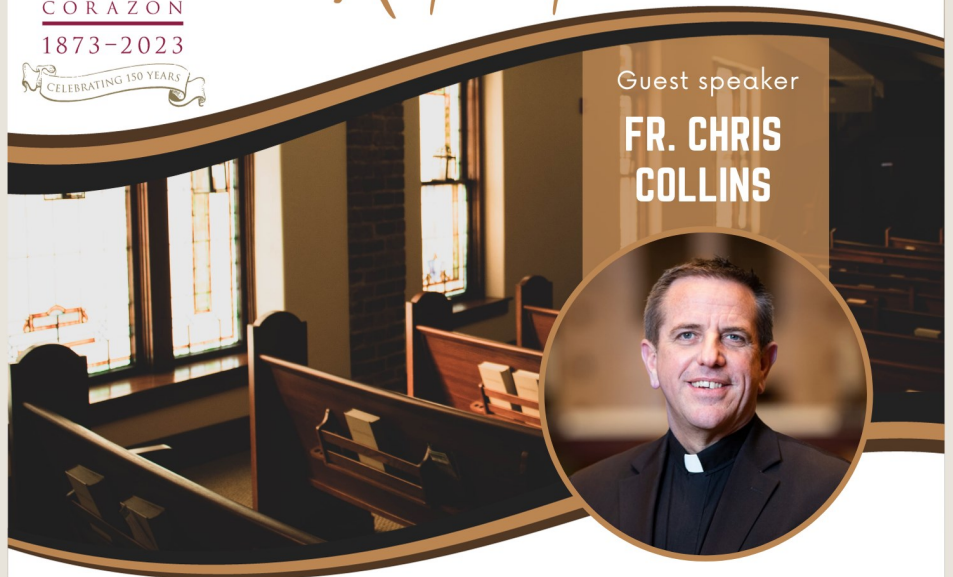

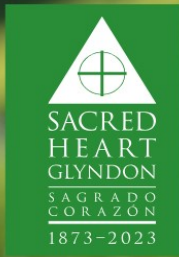

"It's not fair!" How many times do you remember saying that as a child? How many times do you hear your children or grandchildren say that when it comes to the size of the piece of cake or having to do their homework before going out to play or allowing their brother or sister to do something, but they cannot do it right now. Fairness is something we cherish as people. That's why the parable that Jesus tells today seems so unfair. How can the boss pay the same wage to someone who has just worked the final hour compared to the person who has labored all day under the hot sun. It does not seem fair.

Yet Jesus is making a point that is a basic to our faith. All that we have is a gift. Despite what we think, we have not earned any of it. The sun is given to us freely. The gifts of sky and moon, creatures of the land and sea, are all given to us in this wonderful world. Our life is a free gift.

And, despite our frustration, these kinds of beautiful gifts are given to everyone, good or bad, kind or evil. It does not seem fair. Yet God loves all his creation and all of his creatures. He consistently yearns for us to act like we are part of the kingdom. But we have free will. We can participate in the beauty and the work of the vineyard, or we can work against it. In either case, however, God does not give up on us.

September 29-30 in the Main Church**

Fr. Christopher Collins, SJ is the Vice President for Mission at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. He served from 2012 to 2020 at Saint Louis University as a faculty member in the Department of Theological Studies, Director of the Catholic Studies Program and as Assistant to the President for Mission and Identity.

His research and teaching are in the areas of Systematic Theology and Spirituality. His publications include *The Word Made Love: The Dialogical Theology of Joseph Ratzinger/Benedict XVI* (Liturgical Press, 2013), *Three Moments of the Day: Praying with the Heart of Jesus* (Ave Maria Press, 2014), and *Habits of Freedom* (Ave Maria Press, 2022). He regularly gives retreats around the country based on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola.
