"It's not fair!" How many times do you remember saying that as a child? How many times do you hear your children or grandchildren say that when it comes to the size of the piece of cake or having to do their homework before going out to play or allowing their brother or sister to do something, but they cannot do it right now. Our Parish Retreat Presenter – Fr. Christopher Collins September 29-30 in the Main Church

Fr. Christopher Collins, SJ is the Vice President for Mission at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. He served from 2012 to 2020 at Saint Louis University as a faculty member in the Department of Theological Studies, Director of the Catholic Studies Program and as Assistant to the President for Mission and Identity.

His research and teaching are in the areas of Systematic Theology and Spirituality. His publications include The Word Made Love: The Dialogical Theology of Joseph Ratzinger/Benedict XVI (Liturgical Press, 2013), Three Moments of the Day: Praying with the Heart of Jesus (Ave Maria Press, 2014), and Habits of Freedom (Ave Maria Press, 2022). He regularly gives retreats around the country based on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola.
