FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The New Year is an artificially created holiday. The changing of the calendar from December 31 to January 1 really isn't very consequential except that we have made it a big deal as a culture and as a world. Perhaps it's because we need to reset and begin again in so many ways in our lives. This is certainly true this year in our world with so many terrible wars going on, and innocent people, including women and children, losing their lives daily. We are sheltered from most of this kind of violence in the United States, but we suffer our own violence in our cities or neighborhoods and families.

As Catholics, we celebrate the New Year as the Feast of Mary the Mother of God and the Day of Prayer for Peace. Mary can be a perfect model for us, not only this one day of the year but, indeed, for the entire year. She was a woman of prayer who was able to hear the Lord when He spoke to her through an angel. Trustingly, she accepted the will of God without knowing the full measure of its consequences. Throughout her life she remained faithful and trusting. Even in the worst of times, when everything seemed to be falling apart and her son was subjected to the worst possible violence, she remained faithful to Him and to God.

If you do nothing else on New Year's Day, please pray for peace. Of course, we hope that you will join us regularly here around the Lord's table to do what he asked us to do in memory of him every week. Happy New Year and may the God of peace give you peace in your families, your neighborhood, and your hearts.



From Pope Francis' Prayer for Peace

Lord God of peace, hear our prayer!

We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. How many moments of hostility and darkness have we experienced; how much blood has been shed; how many lives have been shattered; how many hopes have been buried... But our efforts have been in vain.

Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts, and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instill in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.

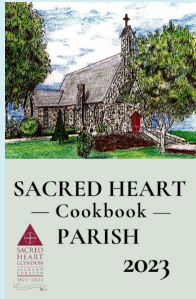
