FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend, we heard of God's call to Samuel, to Andrew, and to Peter. This weekend, once again, we encounter people who are asked by God to do a certain task or job.

In the first reading, Jonah is asked to go to the city of Ninevah and convert them back to the Lord. He doesn't really want to do what God is asking him because he does not like the Ninevites and secretly would enjoy them being destroyed. However, God works with Jonah to get him to the city and within moments of his preaching, the whole city converts!

In the gospel reading, Jesus calls Andrew and Peter, James, and John. They seem like unlikely prospects because they are not rabbis nor evangelizers, nor necessarily trained in the scriptures. They are fishermen. However, Jesus sees something in them, calls them forward, and they respond. We know what wonderful work will come out of them after three years with Jesus and His death and resurrection.

Jesus, too, has a call and a mission, a task for each of us. We may not want to do it. We may not feel like it's our call. But God knows best. Listen carefully each day to God's whisper to us.



Daily Mass and Adoration are **cancelled**.


