## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

God's patience always amazes me!

In the First Reading, the Book of Chronicles tells the story of the loss of Jerusalem and the exile into Babylon. The book claims this happened because all of the people, including the priests and leaders of the people, had deserted God and gone over to the way of other nations, the way of the pagans. They were offering sacrifices that were not allowed and giving into a moral code other than the one given to them by the one true God. Yet God sends someone who gives them new hope, Cyrus, king of Persia. This unlikely pagan king allows the Israelites to return to their nation and their capitol and rebuild it.

In the gospel, Jesus speaks of how Moses was allowed to mount a saraph serpent on a pole to save all of those who had been bitten in the desert because of their wickedness. God sends the symbol again as a cure for their ailments. This symbol, obviously prefigures Jesus being raised on the cross, the ultimate sacrifice to save us from all of our wrongdoing, our waywardness, and our sins.

As we celebrate this, Laetare Sunday, this fourth Sunday of Lent, be amazed at a God, who, despite our wanderings, hopelessness, and wickedness, continues to send ways of salvation and hope.
