FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

We often live life waiting for the big events – graduation, our 21st birthday, our wedding day, our first job. However, for most of us, the big events are rare. Instead, it's the little things of daily life that make up the majority of our time here on earth. There is a saying, "Enjoy the little things in life for one day, you realize they were the big things." That could very much be a paraphrase of Jesus' parable in the gospel today. He talks about the mustard seed being the smallest of all seeds and yet, when it's planted, it becomes the largest of all the trees giving shelter to the birds. The little things that we do are really the things that matter most in the end. They can have great consequences.

One hundred and fifty-one years ago, a few people decided to build a Catholic church in Glyndon. There is no way they could have envisioned the kind of parish we are today with two churches, a large school, a robust religious education program, a parish center, gym, convent, rectory and maintenance shop, much less the 3,000 families that belong to this parish! Yet their little, but decisive actions, paved the way for us in 2024.

In less than two weeks, we will add to their heritage. A triptych or a three-piece painting, will be installed behind the main altar. It depicts the appearance of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque 350 years ago in a little French town. It began the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and underlines God's love and mercy for us every day in little but profound ways. Archbishop Lori will come to bless the image on Sunday, June 30, at the 9:30 AM Mass. Please mark your calendars and join us for this wonderful occasion where we continue to enhance and celebrate our parish community of the Sacred Heart.

Did you know that the entire Universal Church is in a process of renewal called Synodality? What is a Synod?

A Synod is a gathering of the people of God in order to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church and asking her to be and to do. This gathering can involve the faithful in different ways: pastors with lay people, bishops with the other ordained ministries, pope with bishops, etc. Pope Francis call it, "An exercise of mutual listening, conducted at all levels of the Church and involving the entire People of God." It involves encounter, listening, and the discernment of spirits.

The word synod comes from the Greek synodos, which has the general meaning of "walking together". It offers an image of the Church as a pilgrim people, growing and developing on a journey of faith; a very different image from that of the Church as a static institution. A synodal Church expresses the Second Vatican Council vision of what sees the Church called to be: the People of God in which all baptized share the same dignity, and the essential distinction between lay people, clergy, bishops, etc. is a difference of vocation and role, not of superiority.

The Synod is about us, the people of God at Sacred Heart Parish and who we want to become as a Church. Be informed. Learn more:
