FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

All devout Jewish people knew that the sign of the Messiah, and the in breaking of the kingdom of God was when deaf people could hear again, blind people could see, and the world would be transformed in a positive way.

This speaks, the prophet Isaiah and our first reading, "then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the Lamb leap like a stag then the tongue of the mute will sing. Streams will burst in the desert, and rivers in the steppe."

In the gospel, all of these dreams come true.

Today, Jesus heals a deaf man and corrects his speech impediment. Everyone would have known that this signaled the in-breaking of the kingdom of God. This Jesus was not just another prophet, just a nice man, but the Messiah. Do we communicate that to our brothers and sisters? If Jesus is really the Messiah and commands us to do this in memory of him, we have to encourage our brothers and sisters to come to Mass, to come to His feast. He's not just another person or a figure in history. As we begin the Fall season, encourage those around you, one by one, to come to the feast where the healer is truly present.
