# Lent at Sacred Heart

During this penitential season, Masses at Sacred Heart will take on a more somber tone and a spirit of simplicity. After the entrance chant or hymn, we will pray the Confiteor and sing the Kyrie. Use of the organ and accompanying instruments will be more restricted (e.g. there will be no postlude).

We do not sing or say Alleluia, so that our Alleluias may be even more joyous come Eastertide. At the end of Mass, there will be no hymn. Instrumental music will accompany the recession.

## **Fasting and Abstinence**

All Catholics 14 years of age and older are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and on all Fridays of Lent. All Catholics who are 18 years of age and older but not yet 59 years old are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
