- May the peace and the consolation of the Lord Jesus be yours sisters and brothers! Our prayers and deepest sympathies on behalf of St. Benedict the Moor Church—Family to Dorothy's children: *Yolanda, Sonsia, Clinton, Reginald, Tracey, & Rodney.*
- To your families, her grand-children, and the entire Stewart Family. Sisters and brothers....This morning we gather as a family of families to pray for the soul of our sister, Dorothy; for her family, and for all of us gathered that our FAITH in the Resurrection of the Lord and one Day our own resurrection with all those who have died in Christ Jesus.
- Your mother, grandmother, our sister, friend and Church member lives in the Lord. For her **life is NOT ended, but CHANGED!**
- Beginning with our first reading from the Book of Proverbs, the author offers us an iconic image of a **"worthy wife."**
- Your Dad, Jimmy chose well the woman he would marry and together they would raise a family of six children. He was military, serving our country largely overseas as a Master Sgt. in Germany and Korea, while was a NURSE and MOTHER who worked at the Columbus Medical Center,... Piedmont Hospital for 32 years and The Chatachochee Valley Health Care
- *As the author of Proverb says most eloquently:*
- *"When one finds a worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls. Her husband has an unflinching prize."* Clinton attests, that his Mom showed us unconditional love, stability and strength. She was the "matriarch of the family" with her love for the outdoors, grilling, fishing, and gardening that she fed her family and gave them appreciation for all that God has given us. Words that flowed freely of **this virtuous wife** were: **Mom was a sweetheart, a woman with a big heart, who loved her family, her neighbors of 55 years, her garden, and her garden shoes, and simply loved growing vegetables and herbs.**
- Dorothy was a Catholic—Christian woman who loved her God, loved her Church, and loved her

saying: *"give her a reward of her labors, and let her works praise her at the city gates."*

- Church, we are talking about **the works of mercy** and **compassion** that are our living testimony that we have heard the Gospel mandate to serve our sisters and brothers who are hungry, thirsty, sick, naked, imprisoned and dying. Jesus in the **Gospel of Matthew 25:** 31ff is speaking about the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. Write that down for yourselves: it's the final Exam Question—your ticket to ride into heaven—Matthew 25. Sonsia shared with me this clip from the 1970's...As your Mom set-up shop in the neighborhood and with her medical skills began "piercing the ears" of the sistas'....as they walked down the street with a piece of string dangling from their ears. Stepping in fashion and medically free from infection. Sisters and brothers, St. Benedict the Moor has a long history of serving the local community **"a hot lunch"** twice a week for the past 32 years. One of the anchors of the Outreach Program has been Sister Stewart. We are talking about some down—home cooking! She and so many others through their shared ministry made a difference for others, but among themselves deep friendships developed. They are among just some of the living witnesses that could testify to her compassion and unconditional love that she shared with **Jesus in the disguise of poverty and homelessness....Matthew 25 in action!**

Today's Gospel from John speaks of the disciples being somewhat put out having spent a night of fishing and catching nothing. Jesus asks them to cast their nets off to the starboard side of the boat....and to their amazement they caught so many fish that their nets were nearly bursting forth but did not tear.

It's been said of the Stewarts: **"We are a fishin' Family—**Mom loved to fish, love to eat them and loved to fry. She gave you the natural level of loving to FISH...and she invites you in the name of Jesus to throw out the nets...cast the lines....**and go fishing for souls...be fishers of men and women for the Kingdom of God.**

P.S. *The sign of the fish was used by the early Christians as a password. The word for fish in Greek is: ICHTUS: standing for Jesus Christ the Son of the Living God Savior. They marked the place where they would gather for Eucharist with the sign of the ICHTUS/FISH.*

May we see the mystery of LIFE unveil itself in the mystery of LIFE: birth, development, struggle, sickness, and even death. As Jesus was grilling fish on the shore for his Apostles, he is calling us to gather to be fed by His Word, Sacrament, and Community. Let us *go fishin' on the seas of life for more sisters and brothers to assure them there is LIFE beyond death and we are living witnesses!*

Alleluia! and Amen!
