



Dear St. Agnes Family,

As we step back into ordinary time in our Liturgical year, it is a good time to recognize God in the ordinary details of our lives. Fr. Eric alluded to this as well, inviting us to notice the movement of the Holy Spirit in our everyday lived experience. A great way to do this is through the Examen prayer of St. Ignatius of Loyola. The Examen is a method of reviewing your day in the presence of God. It's actually an attitude more than a method, a time set aside for thankful reflection on where God is in your everyday life. It has five steps, which most people take more or less in order, and it usually takes 15 to 20 minutes per day. Here it is in a nutshell: (adapted from www.ignatianspirituality.com Version of the Examen from A Simple, Life-Changing Prayer by Jim Manney © Loyola Press the EXAMEN)

- Ask God for light. I want to look at my day with God's eyes, not merely my own.
- Give thanks. The day I have just lived is a gift from God.
 Be grateful for it.
- Review the day. I carefully look back on the day just completed, being guided by the Holy Spirit.
- Face your shortcomings. I face up to what is wrong—in my life and in me.
- Look toward the day to come, asking God for what you may need

May you savor the graces of God's presence in your days, open to the insights, joys and challenges.

I am deeply grateful for all the kind words, tears of sadness and genuine support I received as I announced my discernment to step down from this role. Ours hearts continue to be so grateful – yet oh so heavy. Just to clarify, my last day here will be Wednesday, July 6th. That is the transition date for all Parishes going through changes of leadership. Let us prayerfully prepare for the transition here at St. Agnes, always in light of the joy and hope of our Lord Jesus Christ.
