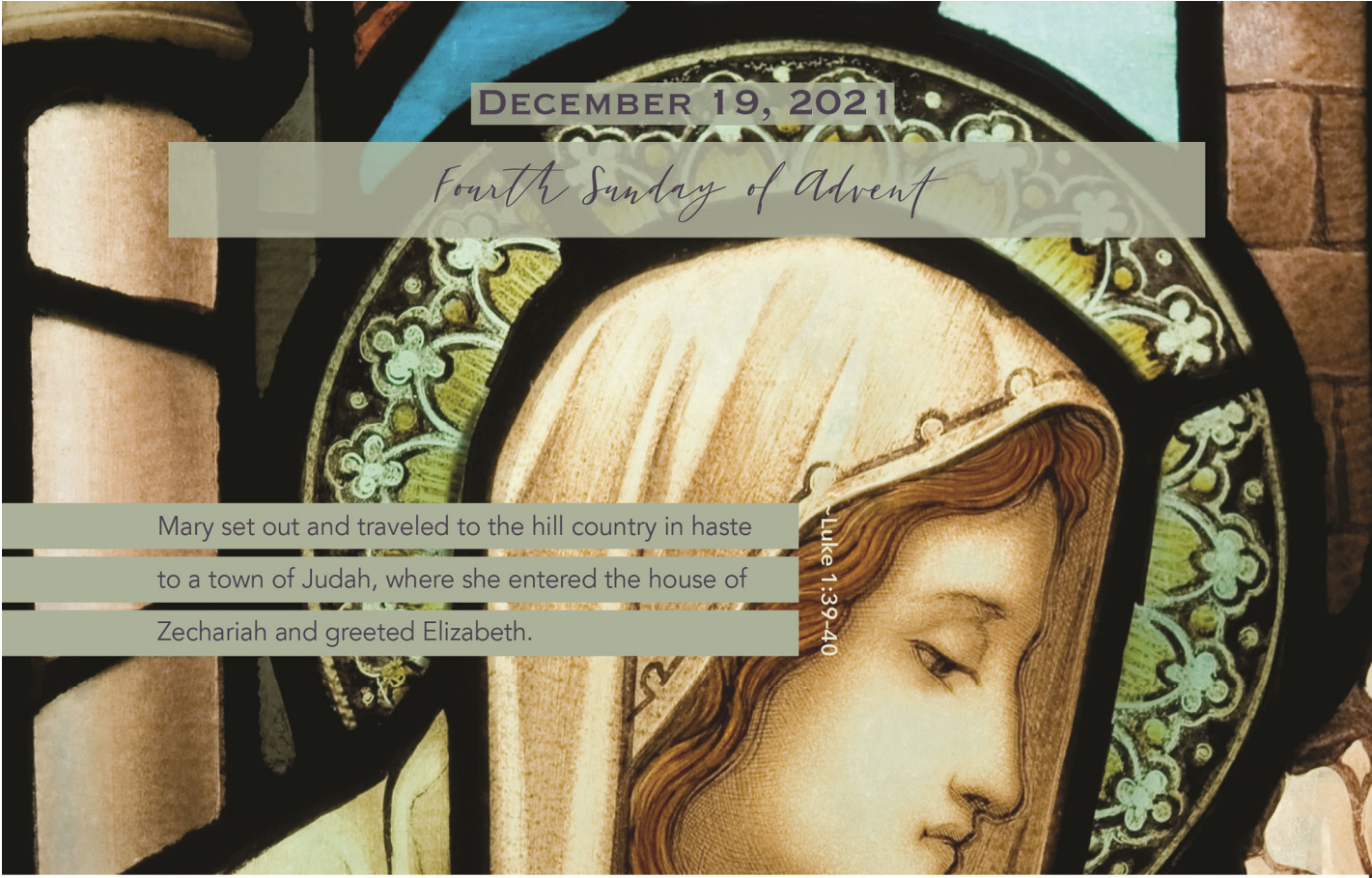

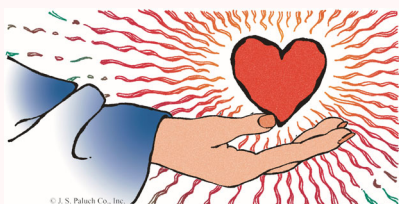


Pastor's Corner

These last few days and weeks before Christmas have seen celebrations that honor Our Lady, Mary. Mary is not honored because she wielded great power and influence. Mary is great because of her constant human kindness and generosity. Like God, **all** she did was done with great love. She willed the "good" for the other. Not only did she *will* and *pray* good things for others: **but she acted on it**. Her whole life was lived for others not self. The Gospel remembers this in the story of the Visitation. In spite of her own pregnancy and personal safety, Mary set out "with haste" to visit Elizabeth her cousin. Elizabeth lived in a place called *El Karem*. That is 100 miles from Nazareth (one way). Mary walked most if not all of that distance (maybe she had a small colt or even a camel, but I doubt the latter. That was a luxury she could not afford). Mary was not just spiritually, but physically strong. Mary loved people so much that she would do anything to bring hope, love, joy and peace to them. She used her physical presence to do good. I am blessed with a dear childhood friend. He lives in New York now. He flew out to be with me and my family when my father died on December 14 (fifteen years ago). We will never forget that. My dear friend dropped everything to be with us. *When was the last time we "dropped everything" to be with someone in their hour of need?* When was the last time we went with "great haste" (urgency) and sacrifice to be present and assist where we could?

As we near Christmas Day I encourage you to love as Mary did — without counting the cost. Put down your smartphones, step back from your keyboards, go with haste, and exercise the Christian ministry of "presence". Be there for others.

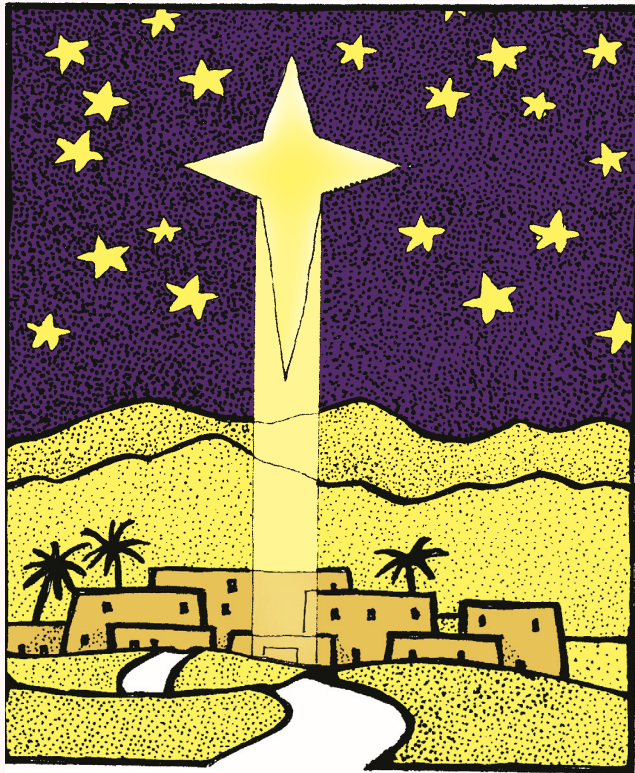

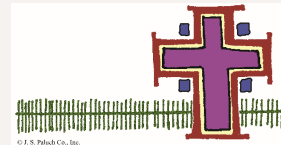

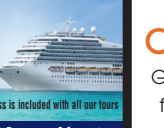
