

### Alum Brings 40 Days for Life to Palouse

Most every day of the week between 4:00 pm and 7:00 pm, Anna Green's slight frame could be seen on the sidewalk, silhouetted against the setting sun. Bundled in hat and gloves, she'd smile and wave at each car passing by the Planned Parenthood in Pullman, Washington. Some responded with smiles and words of gratitude, others with vulgar gestures and angry taunts. No matter the reaction, Anna kept smiling. And she kept praying. What would motivate her to brace herself against the cold wind and smile with joy day after day?



For Anna, it's a passion and reverence for the Lord and His creation. "We can't care for the least and poorest in the world if we can't care for our children. This is God's beautiful creation—He called it into being. He has something planned for each one of us and we could never fathom what that could be." For us, she explains, the call is to protect these women and children so that they might discover God's great plan for them.

Anna is a 2019 alumnus of the University of Idaho, graduating with a degree in Biology. She has always loved creation and the environment and has been fascinated by how it works. "That's the reason that I'm so strongly pro-life," she says.

From the very first day she set foot on campus, Anna was heavily involved with St. Augustine's Catholic Center. It was through the Catholic Center that she learned about Students for Life, the pro-life club on campus, of which she eventually became president. Anna quickly formed relationships with the team of FOCUS missionaries at St. Augustine's who invited her to a conference. There, she heard a speaker who shared stories about his work with 40 Days for Life with beauty and passion. She came home convicted that 40 Days for Life was needed on the Palouse.

40 Days for Life is a 40-day campaign that seeks to end abortion through prayer and fasting, community outreach, and peaceful vigils in front of facilities that perform abortions. Anna began with the Students for Life club, and then reached out to the Moscow Right to Life and local churches in Moscow and Pullman. She coordinated her first campaign in the spring of 2018 and just concluded her third one this spring. Each year, more people have signed up to be a part of the peaceful vigil outside of the Planned Parenthood in Pullman. There are now a little over 200 people on the email list for this campaign.



Anna shares, "For me personally, the biggest challenge has been overcoming how shy and introverted I am. This entire campaign is about reaching out and inviting people into this, and standing in front of a bunch of cars who stare you down." She's had to contact countless people she's never met before, share with Bible studies, and speak at Masses, all of which is out of her comfort zone. But, she adds, "When you put yourself in a vulnerable situation—when you say to God, 'I'm giving you this time and this place'—He's going to use it."

All of the struggle pales in comparison to the joy Anna experiences through the people she's encountered on the sidewalk: the post-abortive woman protesting the vigil who let Anna sit with her, the big burly man with a large pro-choice sign who talked with her for an hour, the strangers who brought coffee and notes of gratitude. "The ability to have genuine conversation about these really important issues makes it all worth it."

# SLS20: You Were Made for Mission

From December 30th to January 3rd, 20 University of Idaho students traveled to Pheonix, Arizona, for a conference called SLS20. This bi-annual conference brought together nationally-known Catholic speakers with 8,000 students from all over the country who were eager to grow in discipleship. We were blessed to have students from a local community college and high school also join our group. The focus of the SLS Conference was on evangelization, and students came back equipped and eager to share Christ with their campuses.


My fears around spreading the Gospel paled in comparison to the realization of the graces Jesus has in store for those who abandon everything to Him.
