**DID YOU KNOW?**

*Teach children everyday actions to reduce the spread of germs*

It is appropriate to frequently remind your children about ways to avoid or reduce the spread of germs and to start practicing at home. Among the tips are: Stay away from people who are coughing, sneezing or sick. Remind them to cough or sneeze into a tissue or their elbow, then throw the tissue into the trash. Get the children into a handwashing habit. Teach them to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing their nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food. If soap and water are not available, teach them to use hand sanitizer. Hand sanitizer should contain at least 60% alcohol. Supervise young children when they use hand sanitizer to prevent swallowing alcohol. **THEME**

Today we focus exclusively on the Holy Eucharist in this celebration of the Body and Blood of Christ. This mystery is at the heart of our identity as Christians.

**First Reading, Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a**

Moses reminds the people of all the gifts God gave them; one very special gift was the bread from heaven.

**Psalm Response for this week**

Praise the Lord, Jerusalem!

Our response reminds us to give thanks for the protection and peace we have received as God's people.

**Second Reading, 1 Corinthians 12:16-17**

Paul reminds the Corinthians that they all receive the one Christ under the form of bread and wine; they become one with him and with one another.

**Gospel, John 6:51-58**

Jesus proclaims that he is the living bread and whoever eats of it will live forever.

Our Scriptures today prompt us to remember the love of God who fed the Chosen People and feeds us in the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ so that we may have life eternal. Eucharist is all about remembering and thanksgiving. As we hear these readings today let us remember God's actions in our own lives so that our thanks and praise can be even more profound.

***This week in Focus*****THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST*****The great gift of Eucharist***

I SOMETIMES THINK HOW WONDERFUL IT WOULD HAVE BEEN TO BE ONE OF JESUS' FIRST DISCIPLES. I would have had the privilege of seeing Jesus in the flesh and hearing his voice. I could have heard his teaching firsthand and witnessed his miracles. I would have felt his nearness and rejoiced in this great gift.

But you and I are offered a gift today that is even more precious. We are offered a closeness to Jesus that is more intimate than what was experienced in those first days.

As Jesus was about to leave this earth, he gave us a means to be united to him in the closest possible way: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." In the Eucharist, we live in him and he in us.

It would have been a great blessing to be close to Jesus as one of his first disciples. But being united to Jesus in the Eucharist is a great gift of an even deeper intimacy.

O banquet most precious!  
O banquet most admirable!  
O saving banquet overflowing  
with every spiritual delicacy!  
Can anything be more excellent  
than this repast,  
in which not the flesh  
of goats and heifers, as of old,  
but Christ the true God  
is given us for nourishment?  
What could be more wondrous  
than this holy Sacrament?  
In it, bread and wine  
are changed substantially,  
into the body and blood of Christ.  
Yes! Under the appearance  
of a little bread and wine  
is Christ Jesus, fully God and fully man!  
The faithful partake  
of a share in him,  
but he is in no way broken up.  
Rather, even though  
the sacramental sign is divided,  
Christ remains wholly in each particle.

**Lord Jesus**, help us to comprehend and appreciate the greatness of your generosity and self-giving in the mystery of the Eucharist. May the Eucharist teach us how to live our lives, and constantly give of ourselves. Help us to love your presence in the Eucharist, and by your presence sustain us.
