## DID YOU KNOW?

Teach children everyday actions to reduce the spread of germs

It is appropriate to frequently remind your children about ways to avoid or reduce the spread of germs and to start practicing at home. Among the tips are: Stay away from people who are coughing, sneezing or sick. Remind them to cough or sneeze into a tissue or their elbow, then throw the tissue into the trash. Get the children into a handwashing habit. Teach them to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing their nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food. If soap and water are not available, teach them to use hand sanitizer. Hand sanitizer should contain at least 60% alcohol. Supervise young children when they use hand sanitizer to prevent swallowing alcohol. Jesus proclaims that he is the living bread and whoever eats of it will live forever.

Our Scriptures today prompt us to remember the love of God who fed the Chosen People and feeds us in the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ so that we may have life eternal. Eucharist is all about remembering and thanksgiving. As we hear these readings today let us remember God's actions in our own lives so that our thanks and praise can be even more profound.
