Prevent underage drinking

The National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism reports that nearly 5,000 children under the age of 21 die from alcohol-related incidents every year. This week in Focus

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Answer the call!

When I was an undergrad, I heard that we should read the Gospel of Matthew backwards, starting with the ending, the Great Commission. Jesus' final words to his followers - "Go and make disciples of all nations" - resound in me and find a home in my heart amidst an ordinary day in mid-summer.

Today's gospel reading occurs after Jesus calls each of his disciples by name, these very ordinary people who had commonplace lives marked by birth, growing up, marriage, children, work, and death - much like our own lives. Jesus calls these people out of their everyday existence to a spectacular purpose: working with him to bring about the kingdom of justice, peace, and love in this world and to prepare for the next.

In calling them, in calling us through the baptism that Paul refers to, Jesus affords each of us a dignity, a purpose, and a value unique to our gifts and capacities.

For some of us, we may be called to welcome the stranger, as the Shunammite woman did, to listen with patience and openness to the prophets in our midst, no matter how unwelcome their message might be. Or maybe we are simply called to respond to someone's need for a cold cup of water to offset the heat of a blazing July sun.

Saint Benedict, Abbot

July 11—Memorial

Patron Saint of Europe and monks

Before the time of today's saint, to be a monk meant to wander into the Syrian desert and never come back, to climb a rocky summit in the Sinai and never descend, to sit cross-legged atop a pillar, to fast to emaciation, or to remain wordless as a hermit in a damp cave in Lebanon. Saint Benedict changed all of this...

Benedict founded Western monasticism, the communities of monks who pray, eat, work, and socialize together in a common chapel, refectory, field, and workshop...

Saint Benedict rests in peace near his twin sister, Saint Scholastica, in a crypt under the historic Monastery of Monte Cassino. The "upper room" of Monte Casino became European culture's symbolic Acropolis and Temple Mount, the beacon to the town, the lighthouse of Western civilization, and it was Saint Benedict who first lit its lamp.

Prayer

Saint Benedict, you were a humble monk whose life remains largely unknown, yet you left a massive legacy. Help each Christian in his home, church, and workplace to labor from the shadows to create light, to be the unseen cause behind great effects, and to light lamps that guide others through the darkness Amen.
