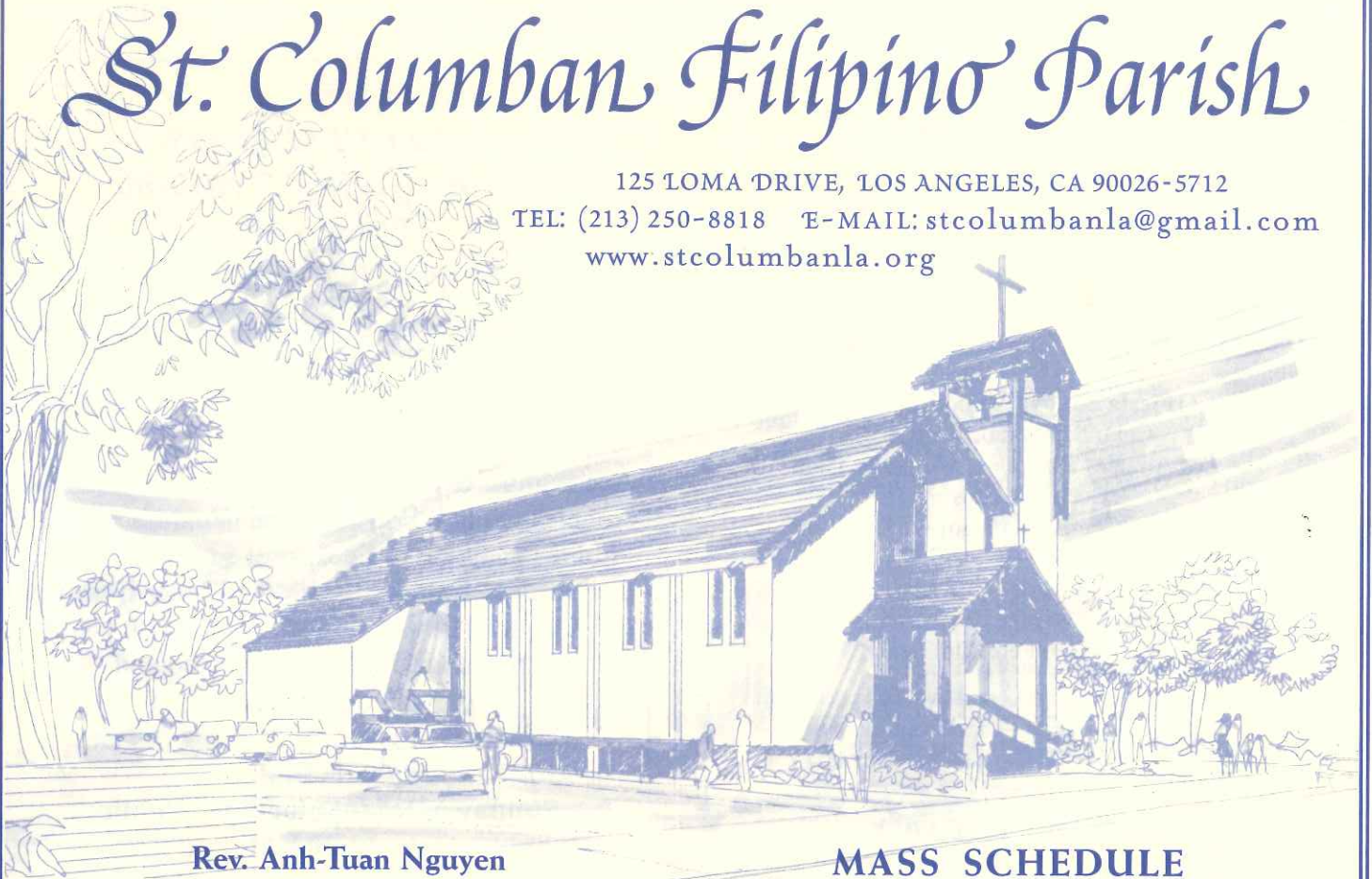

This week in Focus**THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD**

"I AM NOT WORTHY TO STOOP AND LOOSEN THE THONGS OF HIS SANDALS" (MARK 1:7)

Modern theology often emphasizes the humanity of Jesus: he is fully human like us. Thus, we can relate to him and he personally understands what it is to be human. But this insight into Jesus' humanity does not tell the full story.

In today's Scriptures, we witness the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. Even at this beginning, we have indications that there is more to Jesus than meets the eye. John, the greatest of the prophets, says he is not worthy even to take off Jesus' sandals. John sees the Holy Spirit descend upon him. And then there is an astounding witness from the heavens: "You are my beloved son."

Who is this person who is greater than the greatest of the prophets, in whom the Spirit dwells in a unique way, and whom God calls "my beloved Son"? Slowly the apostles, and we, in our journey of faith, come to know that he is the Divine Son, our Messiah. Jesus is one of us. He is fully human. But Jesus is also more ... much more. We, too, are not worthy to unfasten his sandals.
