

PRO-LIFE REPORT

ULTRASOUND REPORT, JUNE 10. 2020

As many of you know, our St Joseph's Council 9202 has been working to provide a new state of the art ultrasound unit to A Woman's Friend Pregnancy Center. During our Needs Assessment Program, in October of 2019, Woman's Friend identified a new ultrasound unit as a critical need for their mission in providing faith based care, counseling, and assistance to new mothers. It is a statistical fact that when an ultrasound is conducted, 90% of will make the life-saving decision to bring their child into our world.

We are pleased to report that all paperwork has been completed to utilize the Supreme Council's Ultrasound Program and we have been given the green light to fund raise. The new ultrasound total cost to the pregnancy center is \$33,000. Our Council's portion will be \$6,248. Supreme will cover one half of the total cost and a grant from 4US will cover the balance. Our goal is to be fully funded by July 1,2020, and have the ultrasound shipped no later than Sept. 1, 2020.

Our Council's financial commitment is a small price to pay for saving human life. We will be asking for your generous support over the next several weeks and expect that donations from our parish (ref. to Parish Bulletin) and council members will easily achieve this commitment. 

A Short Discussion on the Four Tempters of Thomas Becket in "Murder in the Cathedral"

(A future Something Catholic Topic - As applied to Us)

The play is divided into two parts. Part one takes place in the Archbishop Thomas Becket's hall on 2 December 1170. The play begins with a Chorus singing, foreshadowing the coming violence. The Chorus is a key part of the drama, with its voice changing and developing during the play, offering comments about the action and providing a link between the audience and the characters and action, as in Greek drama. Three priests are present, and they reflect on the absence of Becket and the rise of temporal power. A herald announces Becket's arrival. Becket is immediately reflective about his coming martyrdom, which he embraces, and which is understood to be a sign of his own selfishness—his fatal weakness. The tempters arrive, three of whom parallel the Temptations of Christ.

The first tempter offers the prospect of physical safety.

Take a friend's advice. Leave well alone.

Or your goose may be cooked and eaten to the bone.

The second offers power, riches, and fame in serving the King.

To set down the great, protect the poor,

Beneath the throne of God can man do more?

The third tempter suggests a coalition with the barons and a chance to resist the King.

For us, Church favour would be an advantage,

Blessing of Pope powerful protection

In the fight for liberty. You, my Lord,

In being with us, would fight a good stroke

Finally, a fourth tempter urges him to seek the glory of martyrdom.

You hold the keys of heaven and hell.

Power to bind and loose: bind, Thomas, bind,

King and bishop under your heel.

King, emperor, bishop, baron, king:

Becket responds to all of the tempters and specifically addresses the immoral suggestions of the fourth tempter at the end of the first act:

Now is my way clear, now is the meaning plain:

Temptation shall not come in this kind again.

The last temptation is the greatest treason:

To do the right deed for the wrong reason.

After a short passage in which the three Priests and Chorus express their paranoia, fear of "a new terror" and the thought of being abandoned by God, Thomas announces his decision to remain in Canterbury. "Now is my way clear, now is the meaning plain," he begins, explaining that "The last temptation is the greatest treason: / To do the right thing for the wrong reason." In other words, allowing himself to be martyred is the "right thing" to do—as long as he does not do so for "the wrong reason"—a desire for fame and retribution.
