

# Unit 4 — How are we called to become missionary disciples of Jesus Christ?

EQ #2: How do I follow Jesus Christ? (Part 1)

## PARENT CATECHIST PREPARATION

To prepare for this week's lesson:

- Establish a dedicated time and comfortable learning space for your family discovery session.
- Create a <u>Prayer Table</u> (or check out <u>How to Make a Prayer Table for Kids</u>) in a dedicated place in your home.
- Prepare your adult heart and mind by watching one of the following videos ahead of the lesson: <u>HOW TO BE A GOOD DISCIPLE OF CHRIST</u> or <u>THE SACRIFICES OF MISSIONARY</u> <u>DISCIPLES</u> and by reading the reflection at <u>CLONES OF JESUS</u>.

As you are teaching your lesson this week, recall that the Beatitudes from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (MATTHEW 5: 1-12) are like a blueprint which point us in the direction of how we are to live as his missionary disciples – i.e., how we can help to bring about the Kingdom of God right here on earth. Also, remember that the VIRTUES – both Theological (Faith, Hope and Charity) and Cardinal (Prudence, Justice, Temperance and Fortitude) - played large parts in the lives of the Saints, guiding them to lead lives which pointed ultimately to Christ. As Jesus disciples, we are called to die to ourselves and serve one another, as exemplified by the many Saints of the Catholic Church. Their lives bear witness to how we are called to follow Jesus and they provide us with tremendous encouragement in our journey towards holiness.

With your children, consider Pope Francis' instruction on how families can serve as missionary disciples in the world:

"Each Christian family can first of all — as Mary and Joseph did — <u>welcome</u> Jesus, <u>listen</u> to him, <u>speak</u> with him, <u>guard</u> him, <u>protect</u> him, <u>grow</u> with him; and in this way improve the world. Let us make room in our heart and in our day for the Lord..."

Discuss how you as a family can intentionally welcome Jesus into your lives and make time for him each and every day as you grow in missionary discipleship.

 Reflect upon a favorite Scriptural passage that you would like to share with your children about how we are called to live as followers or disciples of Jesus Christ, and explain why the passage is important to or resonates with you. Or, you might like to consider any one of the following:

<u>MATTHEW 25: 31-40</u>, <u>MARK 16: 15-16</u>, <u>LUKE 14: 27</u>, <u>JOHN 13: 2-17</u>, <u>JOHN 13: 35</u>, COLOSSIANS 3: 23-24, 1 JOHN 2: 3-6, 1 PETER 2: 21

## Supplies you may want to have on hand before beginning the Lesson:

- A Catholic family or children's Bible (go to <u>USCCB</u> for approved Bible translations)
- An electronic device with reliable internet access
- Sticky notes
- Art/craft or any unlined paper
- Crayons, markers and pencils
- (Optional): Materials necessary for any of the craft ideas selected during the EXTEND segment of the lesson

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## **OPENING PRAYER**

Begin your discovery session today with your child or children in prayer. Gather together in your dedicated prayer space and ask your children to quiet their minds and hearts as you pray together. Begin with the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u> and then recite a favorite prayer, choose one of the <u>COMMON PRAYERS BY GRADE</u> or sing <u>HERE I AM LORD</u> together as a family. Conclude by praying the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u>.

## **ENGAGE**

#### (Mental warm-up)

**Say**, "Last week, we explored how God/Jesus calls ordinary people to do extraordinary things for the Kingdom of God right here on earth. If our hearts are open to hearing God's call, we obey and follow God's ways. As a disciple, or follower, we are expected to be good witnesses to the life of Jesus Christ. Let's listen to one of my favorite passages from the Bible about how disciples are called to serve God's Kingdom ... (Read your favorite passage from the Bible about the expectations of discipleship and explain WHY it is important to you or resonates with you) ... When we decide to answer God's call and follow Jesus, our lives change forever."

**EXPLORE** 

#### (Pre-assessment of faith concepts)

Ask/Discuss, "What can you tell me about how we are expected to follow Jesus?"

- As your child or children share their ideas, have them jot a few down on a sticky note (with their name) and then place them on the wall in your discovery space. (For younger children, you may act as the 'scribe'). Retain the sticky notes to have an understanding of what your child or children already know or don't know. This will be helpful as you move along through today's lesson.
- To facilitate thinking and discussion above, use some of the following prompts: What is the Gospel message, or the *Good News*? Why is it important? What is a disciple? Can you name any of Jesus' disciples (friends)? Who were they and how were they called to follow Jesus? How did they respond to Jesus? What did the disciples leave behind in order to follow Jesus and his way of life? What are disciples expected to do? Can we be disciples? How do we do that? Is it always easy to be a disciple? Why or why not? What are virtues? What is humility? How can studying the lives of the Saints help us be better disciples of Jesus? *Plus. any others you can think of...*

## **EQ** "Essential Question"

(This question serves as a cognitive bookend for your child or children – i.e..it is the targeted "so what" or "take-away" of the lesson being presented that your child should be able to articulate at the end of your session today).

Share and post a physical representation of the lesson's EQ in your study space:

How do I follow Jesus Christ?

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### **EXTEND**

(As a family, gather back together and have each child share, in turn, what they learned about what it means to be a disciple or follower of Jesus Christ. Together as a family, come up with a list of at least three new things that you learned, were surprised by or think others should know about how Jesus' followers should live their lives as Christians. Then, extend the lesson together by completing at least one of the activities provided below).

#### Early Childhood / Lower Elementary (K-2):

#### **Upper Elementary (3-5):**

- Video: <u>HOW CAN WE BE MORE LIKE JESUS?</u>, <u>WHY SHOULD I FOLLOW JESUS?</u> or <u>FOLLOW HIM</u>
- Crafts/Activities:

## **EVALUATE/REFLECT**

Restate today's Essential Question (EQ) – How do I follow Jesus Christ?

Summarize what's been learned during this lesson, emphasizing those concepts which may have been missed or misunderstood in the EXPLORE step above.

• Say, "Jesus taught us how to be good followers, or disciples, who help bring his mission of love to the world by serving others in a compassionate way. In the Bible, we learn how Jesus washed his disciples' feet (JOHN 13: 2-17), taking care of their physical needs and performing the work normally reserved for a servant. He served his followers with humility as he placed the needs of others above his own, and taught the first disciples how to serve others in the same way by his example. We can also be good helpers (or disciples) when we serve God and others with love in our hearts just like Jesus did.

Through his actions and words, Jesus showed people how to trust God, his Father, and showed God's incredible love for them.

Jesus knew that the work of spreading the *Gospel message* (i.e., the *Good News* of God's Kingdom and His saving love) to others would be hard and that his followers would need his help. Jesus promised to help his followers if they stayed close to him. When Jesus returned (ascended) to Heaven, he sent the Holy Spirit who guided the first disciples in sharing everything that Jesus had taught them about God. The Holy Spirit gave the first disciples the strength and courage to proclaim the *Good News*, and continues to guide every Christian today. The Holy Spirit allows us to shine Jesus' light in the world even 2,000+ years after he returned to Heaven.

Because we are Christians (*aka* Jesus' disciples), we believe in him and follow his example of helping others in kindness and love. Disciples seek justice for the helpless and reach out in generosity to those who are most forgotten by others. We are called to help people with their physical and spiritual needs. These are called corporal and spiritual acts of mercy. Doing what we are called to do as Jesus' disciples is not always easy as sometimes it is different than what those around us think we ought to do. When we place the needs of others above ourselves, we also may have to make personal sacrifices. However, as we follow Jesus and become good examples ourselves, we share the *Gospel Message* and work together with God as he builds His Kingdom. No matter what our age or state of life, every Christian disciple has a special part to play in God's plan. God has given us each special gifts, or talents, which help us live out our mission, or *vocation*. As members of the *Body of Christ* (or the Church) we are called to continue doing Jesus' work even today – we serve as Jesus' hands and feet on earth.

The Saints are God's friends and heroes of the Church. They are filled with the Holy Spirit and serve God with love. They led holy lives here on earth and followed Jesus' example in very special ways. They showed their love for God more than anything else in their lives, even when it was unpopular or difficult. We can learn a lot about being good disciples ourselves by studying the lives of the Saints and following their habits or ways. Many of the Saints led lives of consistently making good and loving choices. This helped them develop habits of goodness, called *virtues*. The word virtue means strength. In Baptism, we are all given the gift of the *Theological Virtues* of faith, hope and charity (love) by God Himself. These virtues help to guide our relationship with the Holy Trinity, with *faith* leading us to obey God, *hope* allowing us to trust in the true happiness that God promises for us and *charity* directing us to love God above all things and others as ourselves. As we practice using these gifts from God like the Saints did, we will grow stronger in these special virtues and holiness.

Each of us is part of the Catholic Church and her family of Saints. We are connected to the Saints who lived before us, but also to the holy people who live now. Saints are not just people who lived a long time ago. God wants each of us to be a Saint, too! Jesus shows us how to be holy, and the Holy Spirit helps us live a holy life every day. The way we show we are God's friends and Jesus' disciples is by thinking about others rather than ourselves, treating everyone with kindness, helping those who need it, praying each day, learning more about God, always trying our best to do what is right and by loving others as Jesus did. Just like Jesus, Christian disciples share the Good News with the world in both word and action.

- Say, "Think back to the passage that I read from the Bible at the beginning of our lesson today. What did it tell us about what is expected of a disciple of Jesus Christ?" (Discuss together, affirming appropriate answers and reinforcing lesson teaching points)
- Separately reflect on these questions: What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus Christ (i.e., a Christian)? What are some specific ways to live out this calling? Why is it important to first develop a relationship with Jesus ourselves before sharing Him with others? What are some ways we, as a family, can live out our call to be Christians (i.e., followers of Jesus Christ)? (After some reflection time, turn and share your answers with another family member).

## **CLOSING PRAYER**

Gather together in your dedicated prayer space and ask your children to quiet their minds and hearts as you pray together. Begin with the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u> and recite a favorite prayer, choose one from the <u>COMMON PRAYERS BY GRADE</u>, sing <u>I HAVE DECIDED TO FOLLOW JESUS</u>
<u>SONG</u> or <u>THEY'LL KNOW WE ARE CHRISTIANS BY OUR LOVE</u>, or ask your child/children to offer up their <u>INTERCESSORY INTENTIONS</u>. Conclude by praying the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u>.

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## **BONUS** (optional)

- What We Pray: The ACTS OF FAITH, HOPE & LOVE are traditional Catholic prayers that that recount the gifts of the Theological Virtues bestowed upon us by God in the Sacrament of Baptism. With these prayer acts of faith, hope, and love (charity), express your faith and hope in God, and your love for God and for your neighbor. Memorize these prayers and make them a part of your daily prayer routine.
- Saint of the Week: Saint Anthony of Padua was quoted as saying:

"Actions speak louder than words; let your words teach and your actions speak."

Read St. Anthony's entire quote at <u>CATHOLIC QUOTES</u> as well as the Scripture passage at 1 CORINTHIANS 13: 1-3, and then reflect upon the questions that follow:

- What do you think Saint Anthony means by this quote? What does the Bible passage noted above have in common with the idea behind Saint Anthony's quote?
- ➤ How do Saint Anthony's quote and the passage from Scripture reflect how Jesus lived His life here on earth and how He calls each of us to live ours as His disciples?
- What is something that you can do in your own life to bring this important teaching to life (and be an authentic witness for Jesus Christ)?
