Unit 2 – How do we get to know and love Jesus Christ?

EQ #2: How does going to Mass help me know and love Jesus Christ?

CATECHIST PREPARATION

To prepare for this week's lesson:

Prepare your adult heart and mind by watching one of the following videos ahead of the
lesson: <u>BISHOP BARRON ON THE REAL PRESENCE OF CHRIST IN THE EUCHARIST</u> or <u>THE
HOUR THAT WILL CHANGE YOUR LIFE</u> and by reading the article <u>ST JUSTIN MARTYR ON
THE ANCIENT MASS</u> to place what we celebrate each week into context.

As Catholics, we believe in the *real presence* of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Have questions? Please visit the USCCB's <u>REAL PRESENCE FAQS</u> for answers to commonly asked questions, or check out pgs. 341-358 of the <u>CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC</u> <u>CHURCH</u> and watch <u>BISHOP BARRON ON CATHOLICS MISUNDERSTANDING THE</u> <u>EUCHARIST</u>. As Fr. Drew has been known to say, "No one would ever leave the Catholic Church if they *truly* understood what the Eucharist is."

- Review the appropriate grade-level learning targets from the Catechetical Framework
 for Lifelong Faith Formation (CFLFF) posted on the Catechist website at
 https://stlaurence.org/the-catechist for your age group. Keep these targets in mind as
 you prepare for and progress through the weekly lesson, making discussion points based
 upon these specific age-appropriate targets.
- Reflect upon a favorite Scriptural passage about The Lord's Supper or the Eucharist that you would like to share with your children and why it is important to you, or consider any one of the following:

MARK 14: 22-24, LUKE 22: 14-20, MATTHEW 26: 26-30, 1 CORINTHIANS 11: 23-26, JOHN 6: 1-13, JOHN 6: 47-50, ACTS 2:42

- Create a <u>Prayer Table</u> (or check out <u>How to Make a Prayer Table for Kids</u>) in a special corner of the classroom. Keep a Bible reverently displayed there to be used for readings in your lessons. When proclaiming *The Word* to children, it is more impactful to read directly from the Bible and not just from their workbooks. This gives them the sense that this is not just any book.
- Establish a comfortable learning space in your classroom for your session.

Supplies you may want to have on hand before beginning the Lesson:

- A Catholic family or children's Bible (go to <u>USCCB</u> for approved Bible translations); on campus, we use the <u>ST. MARY'S PRESS CHILDREN'S BIBLE</u>, a classroom set of which is located in the "CCE" storage cabinet.
- An electronic device with reliable internet access (i.e., an in-class mounted TV or TV cart if a video will be watched as part of the lesson)
- Sticky notes
- Art or any unlined paper
- Crayons, markers and pencils as needed (located in the "CCE" storage and your class bin)
- (Optional): Materials necessary for any of the craft ideas selected during the EXTEND segment of the lesson

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OPENING PRAYER

Begin your discovery session today with the children in prayer. Gather together in your dedicated prayer space and ask the children to quiet their minds and hearts as you pray together. Begin with the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u> and recite a favorite prayer, choose one of the <u>COMMON PRAYERS BY GRADE</u> or the <u>OUR FATHER</u> together. Conclude by praying the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u>.

ENGAGE

(Mental warm-up)

Say, "Today, we are going to discover how attending Mass every Sunday can help us grow to love Jesus Christ more deeply. I want to share with you one of my favorite passages from the

Bible which refers to what we experience at Mass and how it began ... (Read your favorite passage from the Bible about prayer and explain WHY it is important to you or your favorite passage) ... You know, when we attend Mass each Sunday we are participating in a special type of celebration and prayer with our families, friends and other Catholics."

EXPLORE

(Pre-assessment of faith concepts)

Ask/Discuss, "What do you know about what happens at Mass and why we celebrate it?"

- As the children share their ideas, have them jot a few down on a sticky note (with their name) and then place them on the wall in your classroom space. (For younger children, you may have to act as the 'scribe'). Retain the sticky notes to have an understanding of what the children already know or don't know. This will be helpful as you move along in your lessons.
- ❖ To facilitate thinking and discussion, use some of the following prompts: Think about a traditional meal that you celebrate together each year as a family (i.e., Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, Birthday celebrations, etc.). Why do we celebrate these meals together? Who normally attends these gatherings to celebrate with us? What type of food is served? What makes the meal and gathering so special? What is the same in the meals at these celebrations? What is different? What is your favorite part of these gatherings? How are any of these celebrations similar to our celebration of and participation in weekly Mass? Plus any others you can think of...

EQ "Essential Question"

(This question serves as a cognitive bookend for the children – i.e., it is the targeted "so what" or "take-away" of the lesson being presented. If your learners can articulate a relevant answer to this question by the end of the session, you have done your job. ⊕)

Share and post the physical representation of the lesson's EQ in your classroom (Note: Each classroom is equipped with a set of *EQ posters* corresponding to those posted on the weekly *Lesson Schedule*):

How does going to Mass help me know and love Jesus Christ?

EXPLAIN (Either as a class guided with your assistance, or working independently -or in groups- have the children review their relevant grade-level material – listed below - and complete the workbook activities, where applicable).

Grade 1: * Alive in Christ, Chapter 19 (We Give Thanks)

Grade 2: Alive in Christ, Chapter 16 (Gather to Worship)

Grade 3: Alive in Christ, Chapter 5 (The Church Celebrates)

Grade 4: Alive in Christ, Chapter 9: pg. 142-145 (Honoring God) and Chapter 17: pg. 236-

239 (The Seven Sacraments)

Grade 5: Alive in Christ, Chapter 5 (Prayer and Worship) and Chapter 16 (Gathered as One)

*NOTE: We are aware that some of our lower Elementary learners have been delayed and are not all reading ready. As the Catechist or class facilitator, your role is to help your learners understand or connect with the *content* of the weekly lesson. You can convey the assigned weekly content from the *Alive in Christ* textbook in a variety of creative ways that are appropriate and effective for your learners and does not involve the class taking turns reading from the student text. Review the content *beforehand*, and feel free to introduce other methods of conveying it or more specifically adapting it to your learners. Some suggested ideas can include the use of any of the following, many of which are available on campus. Just ask a staff member. These are:

- Story Books
- Felt Board Creation Figures to tell the stories
- Role-playing/Skits
- Manipulatives
- Costumes/Dress-up
- Puppets

If you have any questions or need suggestions, be sure to reach out to a staff member. Be sure to also check out the supplemental resources at the end of this Lesson Plan outline for additional ideas.

EXTEND

(Gather back together and invite children to share, in turn, what they learned about the most important form of prayer, which is participation in the *Eucharistic Liturgy*, or the Holy Mass. Affirm positive answers and interject grade-level learning targets into the discussion, where applicable. As a class (or in groups), come up with a list of *at least three new things* that the children learned, were surprised by or think others should know about celebrating or attending Mass. Then, *extend the lesson together by completing <u>at least one</u> of the activities provided below).*

Lower Elementary:

 every Mass, make and play with a <u>LAST SUPPER PLAYDOUGH MAT</u> or play "Mass" with
 a My Pop Out Mass Kit (see below in supplemental resources-4 on hand) guided by this
 fun video <u>LET'S PLAY MASS WITH FR. TIM</u> using this resource.

Upper Elementary:

- Video Watch the <u>WHAT IS THE EUCHARIST?</u>, <u>THE MIRACLE OF THE EUCHARIST</u> or <u>ON</u> THE ROAD TO EMMAUS video
- Crafts Make the <u>JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST CRAFT</u>, <u>EUCHARIST UNITES HEAVEN & EARTH</u>, <u>LEARNING ABOUT THE LAST SUPPER CRAFT</u>, <u>JESUS IN THE MONSTRANCE</u> or ROAD TO EMMAUS CRAFT
- **Activity:** Perform <u>THE LAST SUPPER SKIT</u> together as a class or write Jesus *Thank You* notes for the gift of the Eucharist which we celebrate at every Mass.

EVALUATE/REFLECT

Restate today's Essential Question (EQ) – How does going to Mass help me know and love Jesus Christ?

Summarize what's been learned during this lesson, emphasizing those concepts which
may have been missed or misunderstood in the EXPLORE step above and keeping a
mind's eye on the grade-level learning targets for this Unit.

Say, "Going to Mass is like sharing a special meal with our family. It is a "sacred" meal, a holy meal, deserving of our respect. It is actually the *highest form of prayer* that we can participate in as Catholics. For some of the reasons we discussed about why we celebrate special meals with our own family, Catholics attend Mass each Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation: to praise and thank God for all He has given us, to gather with others in prayer, and to share in a "sacred" meal...The Holy Eucharist. In fact, the word "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving."

In the Holy Eucharist, Jesus shows us just how much he loves us by turning the Bread and the Wine offered by the community into his very own Body and Blood to feed and nourish us. Just as the food served at a family meal nourishes our bodies, makes us grow stronger and keeps us alive, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ which we receive at Mass not only nourishes us so that we can live good and holy lives, but also keeps us ready for eternal life with God. This spiritual food is the only food which we can eat as human beings that actually *consumes us* (i.e., makes us *a part of it*) rather than us consuming it (i.e., it becoming a part of us). We 'fast' for at least one (1) hour before attending Mass by not eating or drinking anything, so that our bodies are emptied of everything except Jesus before we receive Him in the Eucharist. During the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the separation (or veil) between Heaven and earth is removed as the Communion of Saints in Heaven celebrate this special meal along with us saints in the making right here on earth.

As we explored in the Scripture passage I shared with you earlier today, the Mass (or the *Eucharistic Liturgy*), began as a special meal that Jesus celebrated with his friends, the Disciples. This special meal is called the Last Supper which occurred on Holy Thursday, the day before Jesus died. Every Sunday, we attend a meal just like the Last Supper *at Mass*. Just as Jesus took, blessed, broke and gave the Bread to his friends at the Last Supper, he does so with us at every Mass through the power of the Holy Spirit and the help of the priest (who 'stands' in Jesus' place). During the *consecration* (or special prayer and actions of the priest), the bread and wine *become* Jesus' Body and Blood. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus is *truly present* with us in the Eucharist. And so, when

we attend Mass weekly, we are brought closer to Jesus not only physically, by consuming his Body and Blood, but also spiritually through the proclamation of his Word and his presence in the members of the congregation – the Body of Christ."

- **Say,** "Think back to the passage that I read from the Bible at the beginning of our lesson today. What about this special prayer time we spend together every Sunday, called the Mass, was reflected in that Scripture? (Discuss together, affirming appropriate answers and reinforcing lesson teaching points).
- Separately reflect on these questions: What do you like about Mass? What is hard for you about Mass? How is praying at Mass different than praying at home? Why should we want to go to Mass each week? How can we better participate in this very special form of prayer and better show Jesus our gratitude for His sacrifice celebrated in the Eucharist? (After some reflection time, have the children turn and share their answers with a partner or the class).

CLOSING PRAYER

Gather together in your dedicated prayer space and ask the children to quiet their minds and hearts as you pray together. Begin with the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u> and recite a favorite prayer, choose one from the <u>COMMON PRAYERS BY GRADE</u>, pray the <u>GLORY BE</u> or ask the children to offer up their <u>INTERCESSORY INTENTIONS</u>. Conclude by praying the <u>SIGN OF THE CROSS</u>.

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BONUS (optional)

• What We Pray: The Act of Humility is a Catholic prayer that we pray before receiving Jesus in the Holy Eucharist every Sunday at Mass. In this prayer, we acknowledge our unworthiness before God and we show reverence to Him. We know that He can heal us from all of our sins and help us to live better lives. Read the story of The Healing of a Centurion's Servant in MATTHEW 8: 5-10. What strikes you about the attitude of the Centurion and how/why he approached Jesus in the story? Do his words sound familiar to you? How do his words and actions teach us about the appropriate way to approach Jesus in the Holy Eucharist? Why?

Together, practice and memorize our response to the priest in the *Act of Humility* which we profess at every Mass ...

Priest: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

Assembly: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."

• <u>Saint of the Week:</u> In his recent beatification by Pope Francis, Blessed Carlo Acutis, has moved one step closer to canonization (i.e., declaration as a Saint) by the Catholic Church. Known to say, 'The Eucharist is my highway to Heaven,' this young man developed a special relationship with Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist during his short life. Research the life of Carlo Acutis by reading <u>BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS</u> or watching <u>50</u> FACTS ABOUT CARLO ACUTIS and learning how he used his special gifts to document

<u>EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES</u> around the world. Find out how this modern-day Saint-to-be lived his life to bring others closer to Jesus in <u>MOTHER'S LITTLE SAVIOR</u>.

What do you think Blessed Carlo Acutis meant by, 'The Eucharist is my highway to Heaven'? Do you agree? How can you, as a kid, be inspired by Blessed Carlo Acutis in your own journey towards Heaven?









