CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH

“Still Transforming By God’s Grace.”

My dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord,

Grace and peace be with you on this First Sunday of Lent cycle (b). It is also the Third Weekend of our Black History Month celebration. Of course it is right and just that we celebrate Black History Month not to hate but to appreciate, how far God has brought us. Our Black History Month theme, "Still Transforming by God's Grace," is a testimony of the great shoulders we stand on as we are still making history. Simultaneously we are called to make personal history in this early season of Lent. Our Lenten theme is: "Working to be Transformed." This is also our charge for the next thirty-six days to have a metamorphosis.

We look as a community on the rich history of Africans in America and those who journey with us has made. The last few weeks we prayed in thanksgiving and celebrated people like the Tuskegee Airmen. Our national, community, and ancestral heroes, who overcame Racism, fear, and all other obstacles to make world history. They transformed how the world would look at the African-American (then colored or Negro) because of their intelligence and heroism. God's grace and assistance of others of color and not, brought them to study, train, and diligently, work to become pilots to fight the Nazis overseas. Their story is legendary and an inspiration to all. The Airmen were over 300 men who made up this brave and erudite fighting force. On this First Sunday of Lent, here at the Church of the Transfiguration, we must spiritually accomplish the same thing that most Americans do physically regularly. Interspersed in our celebrations: 1. The communal victory of the African-American despite still having a mighty long way to go 'till total equality; 2. The personal call in this season to real conversion which makes us spiritually "Working to be Transformed!" Our Faith-family will join the rest of the Church and accomplish this by using our Lenten tools of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Communally, we will have a daily Mass offered every Thursday morning at 8am for an extra prayer experience. Privately, we should create extra moments of intense prayer (i.e. Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Stations of the Cross, etc.) to assist us in quest to have a metanoia. (profound change)

Having a successful Lent and meaningful celebration of Black History Month is a daunting task. We must take full advantage of this challenge that will lead to great opportunity for us to live up to our name Christian (i.e. like-Christ). As we are "Working to be Transformed," may God through His Sacraments especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation, bless the work of our hands. By doing so we will make Black, Catholic, American, and most importantly Salvation history!
