From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Advent is the period of four Sundays and four weeks before Christmas. Advent means 'Coming' in Latin. This is the coming of Jesus into the world. Christians use the four Sundays and weeks of Advent to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas.

There are three meanings of 'coming' that Christians describe in Advent. The first, and most thought of, happened about 2000 years ago when Jesus came into the world as a baby to live as a man and die for us. The second can happen now as Jesus wants to come into our lives at this moment. And the third will happen in the future when Jesus comes back to the world as King and Judge, not a baby. Some people fast (abstain from all or some kinds of food or drink) during Advent to help them concentrate on preparing to celebrate Jesus's coming.

Advent Candles

One candle is lit on the first Sunday of Advent, two are lit on the second Sunday and so on. Each candle has a different meaning in Christianity. Different churches have given them different meanings, but I was taught the following:

- The first represents Isaiah and other prophets in the Bible that predicted the coming of Jesus.
- The second represents the Bible.
- The third represents Mary, the mother of Jesus.
- The fourth represents John the Baptist, Jesus' cousin, who told the people in Israel to get ready for Jesus' teaching.

The white tall candle represents Blessed Mary who brought Jesus into the world. In many churches, the color purple is used to signify the season of Advent. On the third Sunday, representing Mary, the color is sometimes changed to pink or rose. I invite you to discover the beauty of Advent especially in your families.

St. Gertrude the Great - Prayer for the Souls in Purgatory

O gentle heart of Jesus, ever present in the Blessed Sacrament, ever consumed with burning love for the poor captive souls in Purgatory, have mercy on them. Be not severe in Your judgments, but let some drops of Your Precious Blood fall upon the devouring flames. And, Merciful Savior, send Your angels to conduct them to a place of refreshment, light and peace. Amen.

Saint of the Day

Nov 30 - *St. Andrew*

The brother of St. Peter and a fisherman by profession, he became a disciple of St. John the Baptist. When he realized that Jesus was truly the Messiah he decided to follow him and became the first disciple of Christ. According to ancient authorities he is said to have been put to death on an X-shaped cross to which he was tied not nailed. Many Catholics participate in an Advent devotion known as the St. Andrew Novena, or the St. Andrew Christmas Novena, in which a specific prayer is recited 15 times a day from his feast day on November 30 until Christmas.

Fri Dec 3 - *St. Francis Xavier*

Born of noble descent at Xavier Castle in Spain in 1506. At the age of eighteen he went to the University of Paris and met St. Ignatius of Loyola. Full of the world and ambition, he eventually saw clearly that his place in life was among the Jesuits and he grew to be a changed man. His travels took him to many places including Goa, India, Japan and other lands of the East. He received thousands of converts and invited them to spread the faith they had learned. He died from an illness in 1552 on an island off the coast of China.

Sat Dec 4 - *St. John Damascene*

Born in Damascus and raised in a good Christian family, he served as a finance minister where he was respected for his competence, fairness, and humility. He vigorously opposed the Iconoclast persecution of the Emperor of Constantinople and distinguished himself in the defense of the veneration of sacred images. After continued persecutions he died a peaceful death in the year 749.

Doctor of the Church. What does it mean when a Saint is categorized as a Doctor of the Church; also referred to as Doctor of the Universal Church (Latin: Doctor Ecclesiae Universalis). In Latin, "doctor" means "teacher." It is a title given by the Catholic Church to saints recognized as having made a significant contribution to theology or doctrine through their research, study, or writing.

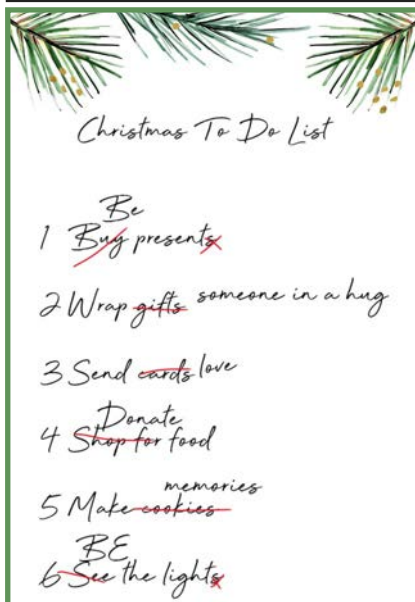

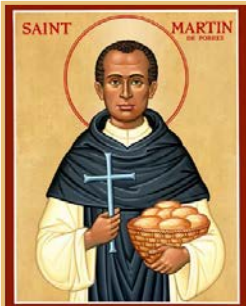


St. Andrew Christmas Novena

Year of St. Joseph

Saint Joseph ~ Savior of the Savior

Saint Joseph can help us to live a most fruitful Advent. These five extraordinary virtues of St. Joseph can help us live a most fervent Advent season and allow Jesus to be born in the depths of our hearts this Christmas.

Silence

- Not once in the Bible do we hear from the great Saint Joseph. This silence is very eloquent. It teaches us a fundamental attitude to enter into deep prayer: silence. It also teaches us the importance of example. We must prove our authenticity by words, but also by our actions.

- Saint Joseph both protected and provided for the Holy Family, as he was a hard worker - exercising the trade of a Carpenter. As we draw close to Christmas, let us beg good Saint Joseph to provide and protect our spiritual lives.

St. Joseph, Our Lady, and Jesus

- To arrive at a true and authentic devotion to Mary, good Saint Joseph can serve as a powerful bridge. Aside from Jesus Himself, nobody on earth knew, understood, cherished and loved the Blessed Virgin Mary more than good Saint Joseph.
