From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

When and why did the Church begin celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday?

The world was in the midst of the Great Depression in 1931 and the memories of World War I were still very much alive in the minds of Europeans when in Poland, a sister of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, Faustina Kowalska (1905 - 1938), is said to have been personally visited by Jesus.

According to her diary, which was listed on the Index of Forbidden Books for more than 20 years, an image was revealed to her of the risen Lord, from whose heart shone two rays, one red (representing blood) and the other “pale” (symbolizing water), with the words “Jesus, I trust in you” at the bottom.

Faustina wrote in her diary that Jesus told her,
“I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish.”

When she was canonized in 2000 under the direction of fellow countryman Pope John Paul II, he proclaimed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, thereby widely promoting the devotional practices associated with Faustina’s visions, already popular in many communities.

St. Faustina, a poorly educated daughter of a humble Polish family, kept a 600-page diary of the apparitions she claimed continued for years. Her entries focus on God’s mercy, the call to accept God’s mercy and to be merciful, the need for conversion, and the call to trust in Jesus. It had been Jesus’ own wish, she wrote, to establish a feast day:

“I [Jesus] desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls... I am giving them the last hope of salvation; that is, the Feast of my Mercy.”

Among the practices associated with the devotion are its novena, the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy (a series of prayers organized similarly to a rosary), the Hour of Great Mercy (a time of prayer traditionally celebrated at 3 p.m.), and the plenary indulgence granted to those who receive the Eucharist and celebrate reconciliation on Divine Mercy Sunday.

The celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday is an opportunity to reflect on the theme of how God’s mercy can overcome sin and, as the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments states, “a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come.”

I invite you for a special celebration today, Divine Mercy Sunday, at 2:30 p.m.

Jesus I Trust in You.

O Lord my God. Teach my heart this day where and how to find you.



Reflections

My First Winter Vacation

A ten-day tour to Poland, led by Father Tadeusz Gorka, January 4th 2023, accompanied by members and friends of Sacred Heart Parish.

Sixteen of us landed in the city of Poznań in the Wielko-Polska Region of Poland, to commence a pilgrimage and to tour the country's diverse landscape, traveling also to Częstochowa, Zakopane, and Kraków.

The entire trip was filled with warmth, comfort, religious appeal, and good times. I had the pleasure of being with 15 great and friendly travel companions. We journeyed via motor coach through Poland, traversing the cities and countryside, along major highways, and maneuvering down small roads into minor towns and villages to visit impressive cathedrals, basilicas, and medieval-era attractions. Boutique hotel accommodations were excellent, including the bountiful morning breakfast buffets. Father Gorka did exceptionally well in planning a schedule of top-rate dining locations for our lunches and dinners.

Our group attended daily Mass and visited close to twenty religious sites. We were given the opportunity to view the magnificent art and architecture of these attractions, as well as the beauty of Poland during a winter month; (towns and cities, many of them dotted with ruined castles, picturesque squares, monuments, and attractive folk architecture), along with spectacular scenery, especially the hilly farming terrain on the approaches to the Tatra Mountains.

The highlights of the tour were:

- A brief visit and tour to the Sanktuarium Matki Bożej Licheńskiej, in the small village of Licheń.
- A three-night stay in Zakopane in the Tatra Region.
 - This town exhibits an original Alpine “feel” and it contained an authentic folk style, Highlander Mountain Region atmosphere. The area experienced a snowstorm during our visit and we were treated with a delightful 9” snow accumulation. Most of the town's dwellings and wooden-framed villas were built in a timber, folksy-style. The local Tavern scene was exceptional, as well as the lengthy pedestrianized shopping street that cut through the Town Centre. Enjoyable also were a cable-car ride almost 2000 meters up Mt. Kasprowy during a blizzard and an evening horse-drawn sleigh ride in the country, followed by an outdoor barbecue over a huge, open fire pit.
- A three-night stay in Kraków, which dates back to medieval times. The centerpiece here was the 14th century of Wawel Castle.

Thank you, Father Gorka, for allowing me to participate in my first winter excursion.
Best wishes to all my travel friends.




