

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Advent is the period of four Sundays and typically four weeks before Christmas. In 2023, the 4th Sunday of Advent falls on Christmas Eve! Advent means 'Coming' in Latin. This is the coming of Jesus into the world. Christians use the four Sundays and weeks of Advent to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas.

There are three meanings of 'coming' that Christians describe in Advent. The first, and most thought of, happened about 2000 years ago when Jesus came into the world as a baby to live as a man and die for us. The second can happen now as Jesus wants to come into our lives at this moment. And the third will happen in the future when Jesus comes back to the world as King and Judge, not a baby. Some people fast (abstain from all or some kinds of food or drink) during Advent to help them concentrate on preparing to celebrate Jesus's coming.

Advent Candles

One candle is lit on the first Sunday of Advent, two are lit on the second Sunday and so on. Each candle has a different meaning in Christianity. Different churches have given them different meanings, but I was taught the following:

- The first represents Isaiah and other prophets in the Bible that predicted the coming of Jesus.
- The second represents the Bible.
- The third represents Mary, the mother of Jesus.
- The fourth represents John the Baptist, Jesus' cousin, who told the people in Israel to get ready for Jesus' teaching.

The white tall candle represents Blessed Mary who brought Jesus into the world. In many churches, the color purple is used to signify the season of Advent. On the third Sunday, representing Mary, the color is sometimes changed to pink or rose.

I invite you to discover the beauty of Advent especially in your families.

Deacon Thoughts with Dave

Growing up as an elementary school student, I attended St. Joseph Parish School, in Bay City, MI, from 1962-1971. I was taught by the Dominican Sisters of Grand Rapids MI. My high school years, I attended Bay City All Saints Central, from 1971-1975. I was taught by the Felician Sisters of Livonia, MI.

At a very young age I learned, in the Baltimore Catechism, that a Sacrament was an outward sign, instituted by Jesus Christ that gives us grace.

We know The Catholic Church has 7 Sacraments that were instituted by Jesus Christ, that are found in the Bible, and have been passed down to us through the Apostolic Tradition of the Church.

In the broadest sense, a sacrament can be any person, event, or thing through which we encounter God's presence in a new and deeper way. A sunset, a period of quiet prayer, a storm, the birth of a child, an intimate conversation with a close friend - all have the potential for revealing God to us in new and deeper ways.

In the broad sense, then, we can say that a sacramental experience is an encounter with God through human experience that somehow changes us. Virtually any human experience can provide us with such an encounter.

However, in the Church's 7 Sacraments, we experience God's grace. God's grace in the Sacraments is the gift of God's love and presence, for us, into which we grow in our faith and empowers us to live good Christian lives.

Have a wonderful week, as we continue to prepare for Christ's second coming, and the Nativity of our Lord and Savior during this Advent season.




