From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

On this, the first Sunday within the Octave of Christmas, we honor the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In honoring them, we also honor all families, big or small. And in honoring all families, we honor the family of God, the Church. But most especially, we focus in on the hidden, day-to-day life of the Holy Family of Nazareth.

The family home of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph would have been, in numerous ways, just like any other home. They would have related together, talked, had fun, disagreed, worked, eaten, dealt with problems, and encountered everything else that makes up daily family life.

Of course, the virtues of Jesus and Mary were perfect, and St. Joseph was a truly "just man." Therefore, the overriding characteristic of their home would have been love.

The Holy Family lived normal family life in every way.


This is significant because it reveals God's love for family life. The Father allowed His Divine Son to live this life and, as a result, elevated family life to a place within the Trinity. The holiness of the Holy Family reveals to us that every family is invited to share in God's divine life and to encounter ordinary daily life with grace and virtue.

Reflect today upon your own family life. Some families are strong in virtue, some struggle with basic communication. Some are faithful day in and day out, some are broken and deeply wounded. No matter the case, know that God wants to enter more deeply into your family life just as it is right now. He desires to give you strength and virtue to live as the Holy Family. Surrender yourself and your family, this day, and invite the Triune God to make your family a holy family.

"Lord, I do offer myself to You this day and in doing so I offer You my family, our parish family. I offer every relationship, be it good or difficult, and I offer every challenge we face. Please come and sanctify our families, making them holy in imitation of your family in Nazareth."

Saint Devotions

Jan 4- St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seton was the first native born American to be canonized by the Catholic Church. Born two years before the American Revolution, Elizabeth grew up in the upper class of New York society. She was a prolific reader, and read everything from the Bible to contemporary novels. Elizabeth's deep concern for the spiritual welfare of her family and friends eventually led her to the Catholic Church. Having lost her mother at an early age, Elizabeth felt great comfort in the idea that the Blessed Virgin was truly her mother. She asked the Blessed Virgin to guide her to the True Faith and officially joined the Catholic Church in 1805. By 1809, Elizabeth Seton pronounced her vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. From that time she was called Mother Seton. She founded the first congregation for women religious in the USA, the Sisters of Charity. They were devoted primarily to the education of the poor and to teaching in parochial schools.



Jan 5- St. John Neumann

This American saint was born in Bohemia in 1811. He was unable to be ordained in Bohemia, or anywhere in Europe, because of the oversupply of priests. St. John wrote to America and was finally invited to be ordained by the bishop of New York. John longed for community and so joined the Redemptorists, a congregation of priests and brothers dedicated to helping the poor and most abandoned. John was appointed bishop of Philadelphia in 1852. As bishop, he was the first to organize a diocesan Catholic school system. A founder of Catholic education in this country, he increased the number of Catholic schools in his diocese from two to one hundred. John never lost his love and concern for the people.



Jan 6- St. André Bessette

When Alfred Bessette came to the Holy Cross Brothers in 1870, he carried a note from his pastor saying, "I am sending you a saint." Alfred was prayerful and deeply devoted to God and Saint Joseph. He may have had no place left to go, but he believed that was because this was the place he felt he should have been all along. The Holy Cross Brothers took him in, giving him the name Brother André. While at his appointment as doorkeeper at Notre Dame College in Montreal, he used his own scant money, to begin building a shrine to St. Joseph in the mountains (what is now the magnificent Oratory on Mount Royal). After many years, he completed his mission and through kindness, caring, and devotion, Brother André helped many souls experience healing and renewal on the mountaintop. There were even cases of physical healing. But for everything, Brother André thanked St. Joseph.

Deacon Thoughts with Dave

The official seven sacraments of the Catholic Church are Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist, Penance and Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Matrimony, and Holy Orders.

They are commonly grouped under three headings:

Sacraments of Initiation

- Baptism incorporates us into the Church and gives us a rebirth as sons and daughters of God.
- Confirmation is a continuation, ratification, or sealing of Baptism through the gift of the Holy Spirit.
- Holy Eucharist is the preeminent sacrament from which all others have meaning. In the Holy Eucharist, Christ is most profoundly present in the Church, which gathers to hear the word of God and to share the nourishment of Christ's Body with one another.

Sacraments of Healing

- Penance and Reconciliation focuses on forgiveness in our lives and our acceptance of that forgiveness, which brings us back to spiritual health in the family of God after we have turned away.
- Anointing of the Sick is where we receive Jesus' healing power for our body and spirit for those who are ill or will be undergoing surgery or a medical procedure. The Church, like Christ, desires the health of the whole human person.

Sacraments of Service

- Matrimony (marriage) celebrates and witnesses the covenant of love between a man and a woman, and symbolizes in that union Christ's covenant of love for the Church.
- Holy Orders (ordination) is a sacrament of service by which men are called to serve as Bishops, Priests, and Deacons.

As we begin the new year, we will reflect, in depth, on each one of the seven sacraments.

In closing, I want to wish each and every one of you a Blessed and Happy New Year.





