From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, celebrated every year January 18-25, has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians from various traditions around the world have taken part in an octave of prayer for visible Christian unity. By putting aside this week to remember that our unity in Jesus Christ is a gift of the Holy Spirit and not something to be taken lightly, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper **"that they all may be one."** (cf. John 17:21)

The Church Unity Octave, as it was known, was first observed in January, 1908. Celebrated in the chapel of a small Atonement Franciscan Convent of the Protestant Episcopal Church, on a remote hillside fifty miles from New York City, this new prayer movement caught the imagination of others beyond the Franciscan Friars and Sisters of the Atonement to become an energetic movement that gradually blossomed into a worldwide observance involving many nations and millions of people.

The theme for 2024 is:

"You shall love the Lord your God ...and your neighbour as yourself..."

The theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2024 was selected by the Pontifical Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity, the World Council of Churches, and the Christian Churches in Burkina Faso, coordinated by the community of *Chemin Neuf*, a French Catholic and ecumenical community of vowed and lay people and its local community in Burkina Faso.

The theme, taken from the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke, reflects the connection between love of God and love of neighbor with a particular concern for challenging the boundaries of who is considered "neighbor". In this Pericope (a set of verses that forms one coherent unit or thought), Jesus is questioned as to the path to eternal life. His answer is not to only observe the commandments, but to also imitate the love of God in the giving of self for another. It is a call for charity, mercy, justice, and unity.

Christians all over the world will celebrate the gift of unity in Christ's Universal church during this week and pray for that unity to be strengthened.

Therefore, abiding in Christ's love, let us love one another.

Saint Of The Day

Jan 17 - *St. Anthony*

Most of what is known about Anthony comes from early Greek writing that depicts Anthony as an illiterate and holy man who through his existence in a primordial landscape has an absolute connection to the divine truth. Anthony was born in Coma in Lower Egypt to wealthy landowner parents. When he was about 20 years old, his parents died and left him with the care of his unmarried sister. Shortly thereafter, he decided to follow the gospel exhortation in Matthew 19: 21, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasures in heaven." Anthony gave away some of his family's land to his neighbors, sold the remaining property, and donated the funds to the poor. He then left to live an ascetic life, placing his sister with a group of Christian virgins. Anthony died when he was one hundred and five years old. A life of solitude, fasting, and manual labor in the service of God had left him a healthy, vigorous man until very late in life. He never stopped challenging himself to go one step beyond in his faith.

Jan 20 - *St. Fabian*

Fabian came to Rome after Pope Anteros died in 236. A layperson, and not a very important one, he may have come for the same reason many still come to Rome during a papal election: concern for the future of the faith, curiosity about the new pope, and a desire to grieve for the pope who had passed. Suddenly during the papal discussion, a dove descended from the ceiling. But it didn't settle on "someone known." The dove "settled on Fabian's head as a clear imitation of the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove upon the Savior." There must have been something of the Holy Spirit working because everyone suddenly proclaimed Fabian as "worthy" to be pope and this stranger was elected! In the short era of peace that followed his election, Fabian was able to build up the structure of the Church of Rome, appointing seven deacons and helping to collect the acts of the martyrs. Many didn't have the courage to stand up to martyrdom. But Fabian, singled out by a symbol of peace, stood as a courageous example for everyone in his flock. He died a martyr in 250.

Jan 20 - *St. Sebastian*

Sebastian joined the Roman Army in 283 AD, ostensibly to be of service to other Christians who were being persecuted by the Romans. St. Sebastian distinguished himself and for his excellent service, he was promoted to serve in the Praetorian Guard to protect Emperor Diocletian. When it was discovered that he was a Christian who had converted many soldiers, Sebastian was ordered to be killed by arrows. The archers left him for dead, but a Christian widow nursed him back to health. St. Sebastian was commonly invoked as a protector against the plague. According to historical records, he defended the city of Rome against the plague in 680. His association with the plague could be because he survived being shot full of arrows and in pagan belief, pestilence was delivered by arrows shot by the gods above.

For the next several weeks we will be exploring and reflecting on the Sacrament of Baptism. The word baptism means "plunging." At our baptism we plunge into the death and resurrection of Christ. Jesus called his death and resurrection a baptism: "There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!" (Luke 12:50).

This is the double action of our redemption: Christ going down into the grave for our sins and rising again, glorious, triumphant, immortal. Through baptism, Christians are united with his saving death and life-giving resurrection.

St. Paul emphasized that baptism is the beginning of a vital union with the risen Lord. The old sinful self passes away to be born anew and conformed to Christ.

This week I ask you to open up your Bibles at home. Read the following passages and reflect on what they say about being buried with Christ, dying to sin, and rising to new life in Christ:
