From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd. This Feast is also known as Candlemas Day; the day on which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the light of the world. So too, those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples. The celebration of World Day for Consecrated Life is transferred to the following Sunday in order to highlight the gift of consecrated persons for the whole Church.

Today we are gathered to celebrate the World Day of Consecrated Life. Perhaps a word of explanation might be helpful for those of you in the Church today who are not in consecrated life. The phrase "consecrated life" describes the vocation of women and men in the Church who have heard and answered the call to follow Christ more closely by professing the evangelical counsels or vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience, and living a form of life that is recognized by the Church. This includes religious sisters, religious brothers, and religious priests. Some are engaged in ministries of direct service such as those who teach or work in health care, parishes, and social services. Others lead contemplative lives of prayer, praying constantly for the Church. The phrase "consecrated life" also includes individuals who are called to live as hermits and consecrated virgins, as well as lay women and men who bear special witness to Christ by lives vowed to consecrated celibacy, poverty, and obedience.

So as you can see, the word "consecrated life" is a general term that includes the many ways in which persons in the Church can be called to lead a more intense life of discipleship, not only for their own sake, but, more importantly, to inspire and encourage all of us to follow Christ more fully in the vocations of marriage, priesthood, or as a single person.

May God bless all Men and Women in consecrated life.
May God bless us and keep us always in His love.

Saint Of The Day

Feb 5 - *St. Agatha*

As with other early Christian martyrs, the details of Agatha's story are based on Christian tradition and legend. The Sicilian-born virgin was martyred during the persecution of Emperor Decius, who ruled from 249-51. She was sent to a brothel in an attempt to force her to repudiate her vow of chastity, but she remained steadfast. Amid this ordeal, her breasts were cut off. Healed when St. Peter appeared to her in prison, she died a few days later from further torture. Popular devotion to Agatha soon spread, and she was added to the Roman Canon of the Mass in about 600.

Feb 8 - *St. Josephine Bakhita*

Born around 1869 in the Darfur region of Sudan; due to her family lineage, she grew up happy and relatively prosperous, saying that as a child, she did not know suffering. Historians believe that sometime in February 1877, Josephine was kidnapped by Arab slave traders. For the next 12 years she would be bought, sold and given away over a dozen times. After being sold to the Italian consul in Khartoum, the capital of Sudan, he took Bakhita to Italy to work as a nanny for his colleague. In turn, Bakhita was sent to accompany his daughter to a school in Venice run by the Canossian Sisters. Bakhita felt called to learn more about the Church, and was baptized with the name "Josephine Margaret." A young student once asked Bakhita: "What would you do, if you were to meet your captors?" Without hesitation, she replied: "If I were to meet those who kidnapped me, and even those who tortured me, I would kneel and kiss their hands. For, if these things had not happened, I would not have been a Christian and a religious today".

Feb 10 - *St. Scholastica*

The twin sister of St. Benedict, she consecrated her life to God from her earliest youth. She founded a religious community for women near Monte Cassino at Plombariola, five miles from where her brother governed a monastery. The twins visited each other once a year in a farmhouse because Scholastica was not permitted inside the monastery. They spent these times discussing spiritual matters. According to the *Dialogues of St. Gregory the Great*, the brother and sister spent their last day together in prayer and conversation. Scholastica sensed her death was close at hand and she begged Benedict to stay with her until the next day. Scholastica passed away in 547, not long after Benedict's last visit. She was buried in the tomb that Benedict had prepared for himself, in the hilltop monastery of Monte Cassino.

As we continue to explore the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, sometimes I'm asked, "What happens to people who aren't Baptized?"

Catholics believe that God's mercy can supply for the lack of baptism in a way that hasn't been revealed. Catholics believe that children who aren't baptized are entrusted to the infinitely kind and powerful love of God who wants all his children to be with him in heaven. Some people once held the theory that infants who die without baptism were excluded from heaven but spent eternity in a state of natural happiness called limbo. This theory has never been explicitly taught by the Church.

Catholics also believe in:

- "baptism of blood" (suffering death for the Christian faith before baptism).
- "baptism of desire" those who "through no fault of their own do not know the gospel of Christ or his Church, yet sincerely seek God and moved by grace, strive by their deeds to do his will as it is known to them through the dictates of conscience," (Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, Lumen Gentium, 16)

The sacraments don't just tell us about something. They are signs that work - they have effect. The sign accomplishes what it signifies.

In baptism, the essential sign is the pouring of blessed water three times on the person's head or the immersion of the candidate in water three times accompanied by the words: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

We will continue our study and reflection on the Sacrament of Baptism next week. Have a blessed week.




