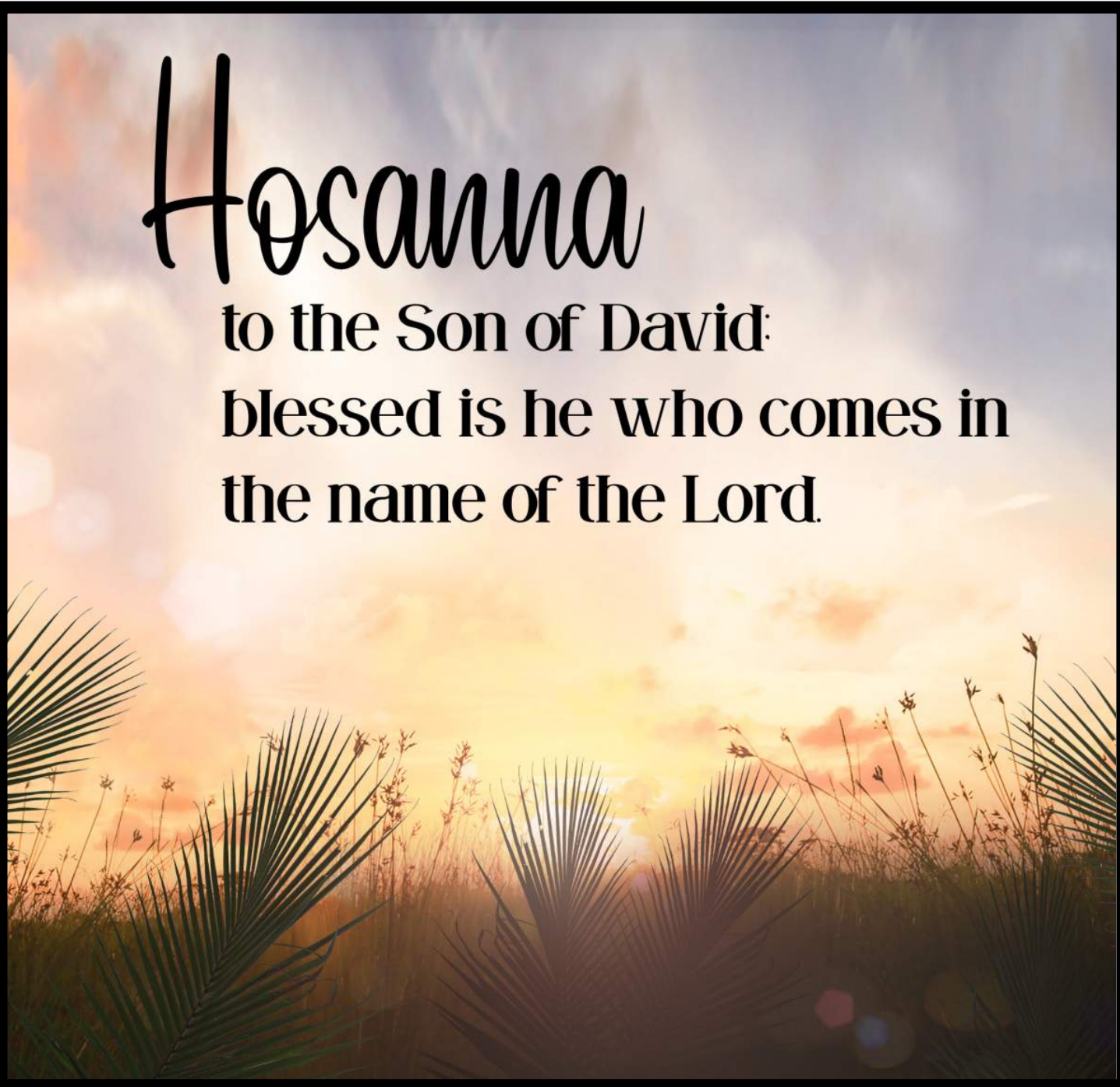

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

We are now entering the most solemn time of the Liturgical Year.

The veiling of statues and images during Passiontide, the two weeks before Easter, is an ancient Catholic tradition symbolizing Christ's suffering. Like so many Catholic Parishes, we too cover our statues and crucifixes in the Church at this time. This custom, possibly originating in 9th-century Germany, includes covering statues of saints, indicating **their glory should not outshine the Master's during His Passion**. The somber purple veils remind the faithful of Christ's hidden divinity and humanity amid His suffering, encouraging reflection on the theological depth of Lent.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday. On this day, we celebrate the triumphant entry of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, into Jerusalem, riding a donkey. On that day, the people laid palms before Him, a gesture reserved for triumphant leaders. We celebrate this at Mass by distributing palms to the faithful who may keep them for a time for use as devotional objects. The palms are blessed at Mass. The faithful sometimes craft portions of palm fronds into crosses.

On Holy Thursday evening at 7:00 p.m., we will celebrate the Lord's Supper. This evening Mass celebrates the wonderful Sacrament of the Eucharist; the great gift of Jesus to us. The Procession to the Repository will take place after Mass. The Stripping of the Altar reminds us of Christ's betrayal in the garden and His imprisonment after the Last Supper. Eucharistic Adoration will follow Mass until 10:00 p.m. There is no 8:00 a.m. Mass on Holy Thursday.

On Good Friday at 12 noon we will have Stations of the Cross and our service is at 3:00 p.m. This is not a Mass; rather, it is a Liturgy of the Word, Veneration of the Cross, and reception of Holy Communion Service. Adoration will begin at 8:00 a.m. on both Friday and Saturday morning.

Holy Saturday evening we celebrate the "Mother of All Vigils" namely the Easter Vigil. This will begin at 7:00 p.m. The first part of the Mass is a Service of Light with the singing of the Exsultet and the Gloria, followed by the Liturgy of the Word that incorporates several extra readings and responsorial psalms. This is followed with the Liturgy of the Eucharist. It is truly a beautiful and meaningful Liturgy. It is longer than a normal Sunday Mass. The Easter Vigil is the first and foremost Celebration of Easter.

Saturday morning at 10:00 a.m., bring your Easter food to be blessed!

Easter Sunday is the celebration of Christ's Victory over Death. It is the triumph of good over evil, life over death, Christ over Satan and sin. It is the Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

I invite you to actively participate in the Liturgy during Holy Week. We are also offering additional times for Confession during Holy Week:

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday: 7:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

The Novena before Divine Mercy Sunday begins on Good Friday. Information on how to participate can be found on our website.

I would also like to extend my gratitude to all those who joined me in making butter lambs for Easter. We had great fun!

A TRADITIONAL POLISH EASTER BASKET

Maslo (Butter) - This dairy product is often shaped into a lamb (Baranek Wielkanocny) or a cross. This reminds us of the good will of Christ that we should have towards all things.

Babka (Easter Bread) - A round or long loaf topped with a cross or a fish, symbolic of Jesus, who is the Bread of Life.

Chrzan (Horseradish) - Symbolic of the Passion of Christ still in our minds.

Jajka (Eggs) & Pisanki (decorated with symbols of Easter, of life, of prosperity) - Indicates new life and Christ's Resurrection.

Kielbasa (Sausage) - A sausage product, symbolic of God's favor and generosity.

Szynka (Ham) - Symbolic of great joy and abundance. Some prefer lamb or veal. The lamb also reminds Christians that the Risen Christ is the "Lamb of God."

Slonina (Smoked Bacon) - A symbol of the overabundance of God's mercy and generosity.

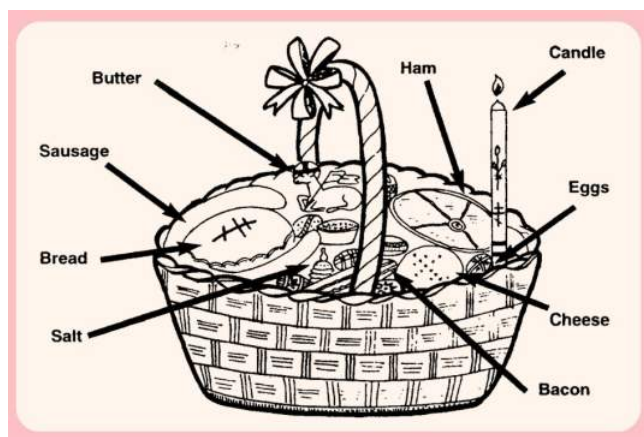
Sol (Salt) - A necessary physical element. Symbolic of prosperity & justice and a reminder that people are the flavor of the earth.

Ser (Cheese) - Symbolic of the moderation Christians should have at all times.

Candle - Represents Christ as the Light of the World.

Colorful Ribbons and Sprigs of Greenery - Are attached to the basket as signs of joy and new life in the season of spring and in celebration of the Resurrection.

Linen Cover - Drawn over the top of the basket which is ready for the priest's visit to the home or the trip to church where it is joined with the baskets of others to await the blessing. The food is then set aside and enjoyed on Easter Sunday.

Deacon Thoughts with Dave

We continue our reflection on the Sacrament of Matrimony.

We understand the true nature of married love only when we realize that it comes from God, who is love. Catholics believe that a marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacramental - a sign of Christ.

In the rite of marriage, the Church recognizes the exchange of consent between the spouses to be the indispensable element that makes the marriage. The bride and groom mutually give themselves to each other. "I take you to be my wife - I take you to be my husband." This consent that binds the spouses to each other finds its fulfillment in the two becoming one flesh (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1626-27). The consent must be freely given.

The couple exchange rings as a sign of their love and fidelity to each other and as a reminder of God's never ending love and faithfulness.

A married couple makes Christ present to each other. That's why the minister of the sacrament of matrimony are the husband and wife. The priest or deacon is the Church's witness of this sacrament.

"We have come to know and to believe in the love God has for us. God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him." (1 John 4:16)
