- A. Call to Order: The September 13, 2022 St. Stephen Catholic School Advisory Board Meeting was called to order at 6:29 pm by Al Larson.
- B. Prayer: Opening prayer was led by Father Antony. Scripture Reading was read by Linda Umoh. Discussion by all present followed.
- C. Approval of Minutes: May 10, 22 was the last time the board met. The minutes were approved.
- D. Roll Call: The following members were present:
  - a. Board Members: Tom Danahy, Dawn Dyer, Jackie Higginbottom, Al Larson, Roy Palomo, Austin Simon, Gloria St. Armant
  - b. Ex-Officio Members: Linda Umoh (School Principal), Mary Gurley (School Assistant Principal), Fr. Anthony Ustick (Parochial Vicar), Tom Dolye (Parish Manager), Ted Russell (Pastoral Council Liaison), Hendrik Cloete (Finance Council Liason)
- E. Principal's Reports (Linda Umoh)
  - a. Enrollment:
    - i. End of 2022 school year with 255 enrolled; now 277 enrolled with 6<sup>th</sup> grade at capacity.
    - ii. Goal class size 25-30 students
    - iii. Increase in number of those eligible for scholarship may have been helpful in growth
    - iv. School has turned away a few students with Exceptional Ability Needs
  - b. Revised Budget
    - i. Statemen of Activities provided and reviewed
    - ii. Original budget amended due to increased enrollment
    - iii. Facilities:
      - 1. Lightning strike in May incurred expenses after July 1

- 2. New PA System: contract initiated by Diocese due to cost, money from last year's budget to cover expense
- 3. Fire Alarm: awaiting parts due to supply chain issues
- 4. PPE loans forgiven
- 5. Advisory Board approved Revised Budget for 2022-2023.
- c. Middle School Wing
  - i. Current estimate \$2.5 million to build new wing
  - ii. Goal of \$1.5 million to start planning for new wing
  - iii. Linda meeting with Dr. Mark Majeski to create a proposal for the Diocese to start Capital Campaign
- d. ERC Grant
  - i. New tax credit for non-profits as part of the CARES Act
  - ii. Estimated value \$600,000 to \$1 million with 7% contingency fee
  - iii. Could be applied to efforts for Middle School Wing
- e. Accreditation Self-study Calendar
  - i. Accreditation through FL Catholic Conference, every 7<sup>th</sup> year
  - ii. SSCS currently in 6th year, which is a self-study year
  - iii. Linda working on a 3 to 5 year Financial Plan
  - iv. Austin, Tom Danahy, Hendrik, Parish Finance Committee to lend support
- f. Scrip
  - i. Previously utilized by SSCS as a passive fundraiser
  - ii. Linda in ongoing planning with Scrip- currently Scrip uses physical gift cards; goal is to offer electronic options as well
- F. Parish Council Reports
  - a. Finance (Hendrick Cloete)
    - i. PPE loans for school forgiven
    - ii. Last school year's parish support for school approximately \$100,000; they have not discussed this year's contribution yet
  - b. School (Ted Russell)
    - i. Ongoing reviewing goals and objectives of ministries
    - ii. School and Angels Among Us sponsoring Men's Club Nov. Golf Tournament
    - iii. Electives have restarted in school this year after several years on hold due to COVID restrictions
  - c. Parish Update (Tom Doyle)
    - i. Recent Parish retreat went very well
    - ii. Uniform Sundays continue to be important for visibility of SSCS students in the Parish community
    - iii. New yard work company up and running
    - iv. New hire for Parish Communications
    - v. Ongoing efforts to contribute to Church debt relief
- G. Old Business: There was no old business to discuss.
- H. New Business
  - a. Officers for 2022-2023 Term

- i. Al Larson will continue in role as Chairperson, agreed by all present
- ii. Jackie Higginbottom will take on role of Secretary, agreed by all present
- b. Reflections of school board members shared with new members
  - i. Discussed accomplishments in the prior year and how they assisted the school (creating the vision for the media center)
  - ii. It was mentioned that they wish to be more active in helping the school
  - iii. Board members will assist in creating a 3-5 year financial plan
- c. Jackie shared information on PTCO upcoming General Meeting on Tues. Oct. 11 at 5 pm in school Media Center
- d. Linda opened discussion regarding tuition rate for active-practicing Catholics vs. Non-Catholics; she will discuss further with Fr. Dermont (Reference Parent/Student Handbook)
- e. Proposed that next meeting move from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday in November due to election day; Linda to confirm new day (Tuesday, November 15)
- I. Adjournment/Closing Prayer: Meeting was closed in prayer by Father Anthony and adjourned at 8:10 pm
