Good News!

January 7, 2018 The Epiphany of the Lord (B) Is 60:1-6; Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6; Mt 2:1-12

A mysterious scene barely comes to light before us. Are we inside or outside of a Roman portico? What is going on in the background? The central scene clearly shows the Child Jesus perched in the Virgin's arms and surrounded by swaddling clothes. A glow emanates from the Child that enlightens the three Wise Men processing toward Jesus. Their whole caravan chaotically crowds around and strains to see the king they have come to worship. A dalmatian wanders behind while a camel appears in the back lighting with a knowing smirk. The Ethiopian sage sympathetically stares out from the center of the painting and seemingly asks us if we understand the significance of their travels.

The arrival of these astronomers from the East sends a very important message for all of us at Mass today. Jesus is the light of the whole world, and all peoples no matter how far or how lost—are invited by his attractive and saving light. This light came to the Chosen People and will be fully consumed in Jerusalem as Isaiah prophesies. Yet he will proclaim that all peoples are invited to be members of the same family and coheirs to the treasures of God's love and mercy. Faith in him and acceptance of his gospel truth is all he asks. So no matter how far you or anyone you know seems from Jesus and his truth, he loves them and wants them around his table to experience his love.

Operation 2018 by Michael Horn

We have done it before. We sit and think and try to prepare for a new year. We want to lose weight or take up a new hobby or activity. We want to be more attractive or happy or change for the better. We want to be more patient, more disciplined, more holy, but how earnestly do we desire these things? Perhaps we failed to achieve our resolutions from last year. Who cares? How strong is our desire to attain them and our faith in God's grace this year? Those will determine if we in fact reach our goals.

In our quest for authentic happiness, it is vital to remember the primacy of the spiritual life and how it must pervade all that we do. We need to assess our spiritual health daily and consider how we are doing. We might be very fit physically and emotionally. We might have an amazing job that pays well and fulfills us. However, if we neglect the spiritual component, we will never have all that we desire. We are finite beings longing for the Infinite, and only the Infinite can infinitely satisfy. So how are we doing?

My first recommendation as we enter 2018 is to ask ourselves how we pray most effectively. How do we connect with Jesus Christ on an individual level and on a communal level? The Eucharist is obviously a fantastic means for fortification of our spiritual lives. A personal encounter with our Lord is always found in this Sacrament of Sacraments. In addition, though, consider the other ways that the Mass offers us sustenance. The Word of God that we hear, the prayers prayed by the priest and the congregation, the intention of the Mass, and the songs we sing can all lead us to know the Lord and express our desire for Him. The Mass is the magnificent source and summit for our lives.

As for the numerous other ways we can pray effectively, we can think of our time in meditation on Scripture, a retreat, a sacred space, a devotion to the saints in heaven, or other spiritual practices. What is important is to stick to the practices that lead you to joy and a deeper knowledge and love of the Lord. I personally have been struggling with the Rosary lately. I realize that it is a necessary devotion, as Our Lady of Fatima told us. Sometimes, however, it becomes rote and dry for me. For this reason, I have switched from a focus on the mysteries to a focus on intercessory prayer for at least 50 individuals. I can pray for these individuals on the Hail Mary beads of the five decades. This enables me to pray for many beloved souls I know, and it is consoling to know that Mary is also interceding for them, and she is significantly more holy than I am.

My second recommendation for this new year is to reflect on the opportunities we are seizing on the communal level for growth. Do we plan to attend the Men's Conference or Women's Conference? What about a weekly or monthly Bible study or discussion group? Perhaps a service project in the parish? We cannot do this alone; there is strength in the pack. The great communities and apostolates of recent years show what a zealous group of individuals can accomplish when united as a community with a common mission.

Finally, let's consider how we impact other people DAILY. How can we lead one more person to Christ each day? Is it through our kind words, a personal invitation to an event, our prayer for someone in the moment, our abstention from making a snarky comment, or simply our patience in a trying situation? Often, we must keep watch and do these things for our spouse or children. We have families, coworkers, friends, and acquaintances who are all called to follow Jesus. However, sometimes they need a gentle and loving reminder from us that Jesus wants everything from us, not our leftovers but our first fruits. He is not one thing among many but rather the Way, the Truth, and the Life. He is not our last priority but our King above all Kings and Lord above all Lords.

Blessings to you for 2018! Let's take care of the Lord's business this year, no matter how fortunate or devastating the prior year has been. Avanti!
