Why does the Church honor St. Joseph?

Saint Joseph was chosen by the Lord to be the spouse of Mary and a guardian of the Word Incarnate, Jesus Christ. The little we know about Joseph is taken from the Gospels. In the Book of Matthew, we learn that Mary is betrothed to Joseph, "a righteous man" (Matthew 1:19). When Joseph learns that Mary is already with child, he decides to dismiss her quietly so as not to disgrace her publicly. But an angel of the Lord appears to him in a dream and tells him not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife and informs him that she will bear the child of the Holy Spirit, the one who will come to save people from their sins. Joseph obeys the angel without question.

Joseph heeds God's call once again when instructed by an angel of the Lord to flee Bethlehem to escape the murderous Herod. Matthew tells us: "Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt" (Matthew 2:14).

It is this faithfulness, this steadfast and complete trust in God, that makes Joseph such a wonderful example for us, and for this, the Church honors him.

As the spiritual leaders of our parishes we are including below several resources that can be used and shared with your parishioners during this time to encourage ways they can stay connected through prayer. While it is certainly difficult to be unable to celebrate Mass as a parish, there are many other things we can be doing during this time to stay sacramentally connected . Along with the directives and mandates already set forth from the Archbishop, following are several resources that you may find beneficial.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Receiving the Blessed Sacrament in the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith, but during these unprecedented times and to ensure the health and safety of all people, it is not possible to receive the Sacrament during this time. However, there are still opportunities to draw close to Christ and unite with the Church during these difficult times.

“The Church obliges the faithful "to take part in the Divine Liturgy on Sundays and feast days" and, prepared by the sacrament of Reconciliation, to receive the Eucharist at least once a year, if possible during the Easter season.”

THIS WEEKS READINGS

In the first reading God chooses the overlooked son of Jesse, for God sees beyond appearances. In the Gospel, the Pharisees cannot see past the appearance of sin whereas the man who was formerly blind sees that Jesus is Lord. As we listen to the readings, let us think about our blind spots and the times when we fail to see beyond appearances.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

When have I judged someone unkindly without taking the time to look deeper? What can I do to remember to allow Christ to illuminate my way?

“Have you ever been rejected? Misunderstood? Did it make you question your value, feel worthless? Unlovable? Jesus was condemned unjustly to heal us of that.”

With these words, Fr. David Knight invites us to journey to the cross with Jesus as a way to heal our own pain, grief, and woundedness. Our true identity, Fr. Knight says, is identification with Christ. So, “we are healed of all rejection—given and received—when we identify ourselves and others with Jesus rejected, crucified, and triumphant.”

As Fr. Knight says so beautifully, “The way of the cross is the most important moment of Jesus’ life—for him, and for us. The cross turns pain into love. And love is the fullness of life.”
