Humility Dynamic Catholic, Alive! – Humility While

Jesus was experiencing crucifixion, suffering the death of one who was a criminal, people reviled Him saying, “You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself, if you are the Son of God, [and] come down from the cross!” St. Thomas Aquinas once wrote that the cross exemplifies every virtue. Humility was certainly among those virtues. Just as Jesus experienced a most humble birth in a manger surrounded by animals, He also suffered a most humble death. The King of Kings and Lord of Lords is judged by a governor and suffers the death of a criminal. He could have come down from the cross and freed Himself of the pain. Instead, He humbled Himself and died for you, for me, for all people. One of the best responses we can have as we gaze upon the Crucified One is silence and contemplation. 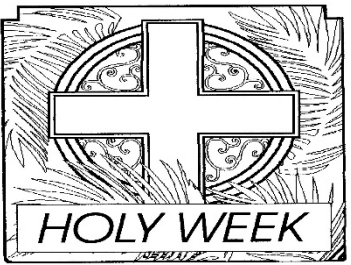

Deacon Diaper Drive, March 14-April 4. Babies and children need diapers all year round. 1 in 3 U.S. families reports experiencing diaper need. 5 million children in the U.S. aged 3 or younger live in poor or low income families. Infants require up to 12 diapers per day, toddlers about eight. Disposable diapers can cost \$70 to \$80 per month per baby. No state or federal child safety net program allocates dollars specifically for the purchase of diapers. Let's be pro-life and help our young mothers. Diapers collected will be stay in the parish and/or donated to Caring Hearts agency in Potosi.
