

Children of God to be Remembered in October

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Chapter 18 of the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel, from which today's First reading is taken, is designed to read like a legal case with God serving as the judge. The chapter opens with a question about whether a person's children and grandchildren must pay the price of the parent's sin. The judge says, "No! Everyone is responsible for their own wrongdoing." The questions continue, "will a sinner who repents still suffer the punishment of his sin?" The judge says, "No." "What happens if a good person turns evil?" The judge says, "They shall die!" Finally, as today's First Reading opens, Ezekiel imagines someone grumbling about God's ways being unfair. The response is unwavering: God has compassion on the one who repents, but those who embrace evil ways will pay the price.

The Gospel also has the tone of a courtroom, except that Jesus takes on the role of judge, and the learned men who are associated with the Temple discover, at the end of the story, that they are the accused. Imagine their surprise! But Jesus is extremely direct with his words. Sinners who repent of their evil ways will enjoy the reign of God, but those who feign righteousness and pretend that they have no need of repentance are excluded.

In the same vein, the Second Reading offers a simple yet challenging guide to righteous living. Paul tells the community at Philippi that they should be united in every way and that they should have the same attitude (and pattern of behavior) as Christ Jesus who emptied himself in obedience to the point of death and whom God honored by exalting him above every creature to the glory of God.

The Gospel is the story within a story. Among the characters mentioned in the outer story, whom do the two sons in the inner story represent? How do you relate to these stories?

Reread the Gospel in light of the first Reading and Psalm. How do they help you understand the Gospel?

What does it mean for you to take on the attitude of Christ Jesus?

PARISH NURSE MINISTRY

I have decided this month to speak about our Parish Nurse Ministry here at St. Michael. Emulating the teachings of Jesus to heal body and soul many Faith Communities have initiated a Parish Nurse Program. Utilizing nurses brings body, mind and soul together in the healing process. Most nurses are natural healers that know the connection between faith and healing.

My ministry here at St. Michael is a variable one given the day. I spend time visiting parishioners with health concerns, help individuals and families cope with aging and illness; support caregivers; serve as a resource to health services and agencies; work with people at Hudson Senior Center when the need arises; I provide health and wellness education through my monthly column in the bulletin as well as when asked to speak to various parish meetings and lastly I assist with the morality lectures required by the Archdiocese for the upper grade children in Religious Ed. Since a wide range of age is found within a parish, the parish nurse must be able to relate to all generations in a way that brings health care as well as spiritual care to the community.

The Prayer Shawl Ministry also falls under my auspices. This ministry provides the Baptism robes given at a child's Baptism, blessed shawls to hospitalized, sick and otherwise infirmed among us. The ladies in this ministry also make hats for all ages and these are donated to Our Father's Table during the winter months and especially at Christmas.

In conclusion if a health need in the parish arises I do my best to take action under the direction of the pastor. Health is not an end in itself. It is not the purpose of life but it helps to serve life's purpose. I welcome any and all nurses in the parish to call me if they would care to assist me in this ministry. It is a volunteer position and even if you could spare ONE hour a week you have no idea how much that would mean to a person in need. 
