Shepherding a parish is not always an easy role. Oftentimes you find yourself having to make decisions that are difficult and even painful in the short-term with an eye toward the long-term good for the people you're charged with serving as pastor. It's always a matter of steering in the direction that is needed now in order to begin to prepare for future conditions. Otherwise, the changes that are on the horizon will fall on you—and on everyone that you serve—like a storm. And then that causes even greater stress.

The Archdiocese of Boston is asking parishes to move in a different direction with regards to religious education. In fact, even the label is changing from “religious education” to “faith formation.” The diocese is issuing new standards for parish sacramental preparation and catechesis. The responsibilities involved will be greatly enlarged, and even re-shaped in a lot of ways.

I know there has been a lot of anxiety over the religious education program here at St. Michael. I know that, in the past, it has been in a less than stable state. And I know that there has been a lot of anxiety over our current Coordinators of Religious Education being asked to step down. Please believe me when I say that I appreciate that anxiety, and to a large extent even share it myself.

I want to thank Roz and Brian for stepping forward two and three years ago, respectively, to help keep this program afloat. They ran into the fire during a difficult time, a time of instability and crisis for this program. They did an admirable job with responsibilities that no one had equipped them for. I know from first-hand experience how much stress comes with being in such a position, and what that stress can do to our overall wellbeing.

They rightly share the gratitude of our whole parish community, and I myself am sincerely grateful to them. My hope is that they both can return to the lives they had put on hold to help us through the time of transition, and that they will always know St. Michael as their spiritual home. I lift them both up in prayer every morning, as I do everyone at St. Michael. I ask that you please pray for them too, and for our parish. After the Lord's ascension into Heaven, the apostles also found themselves having to adjust to new circumstances, but this ultimately led to Pentecost and their announcing the Gospel to all the world. Times of transition have always been difficult, but they present us with new opportunities and new challenges to live our lives with a deeper faith in Christ.

Ser o responsável por uma paróquia nem sempre é uma fácil tarefa. Muitas vezes te encontras a ti mesmo a ter que fazer decisões difíceis e até dolorosas num curto tempo de espaço com os olhos fixados no futuro de fazer o bem às pessoas de que tens a responsabilidade de servir como pastor. É sempre o facto de manter o olhar na direção que é necessária no presente em ordem de preparar condições no futuro. De modo contrário, as mudanças que aparecem no horizonte caíram sobre os teus ombros – e em todos os que serves – como um temporal. E então aí causa ainda mais stress.

A Arquidiocese de Boston está pedindo às paróquias que se mudem em diferentes direções a respeito da da educação religiosa (catequese). Até mesmo o nome do rótulo mudou de “educação religiosa” para “ formação de fé.” A diocese está preparando um novo critério para a preparação sacramental e o catequismo da paróquia. A responsabilidade envolvida é muito grande, e até remodelada em muitos sentidos.

Eu sei que tem havido muito ansiedade no programa de catequese aqui na nossa paróquia de S. Miguel. Eu também sei que no passado, tem estado num pobre sentido estável. E sei que tem havido muita insatisfação no caso de os coordenadores da catequese terem sido eliminados. Por favor acreditem que quando eu digo que aprecio a ansiedade, numa larga dimensão também envolve a mim mesmo.

Eu quero agradecer à Roz e ao Brian por à dois e três anos terem respeitadamente ajudado a pôr este programa em movimento. Eles correram em direção ao fogo durante um tempo difícil, um tempo inseguro e de crise para o programa de catequese. Eles fizeram um excelente trabalho que ninguém estava preparado para o fazer. Eu sei por experiência própria quanto stress causa por estar numa posição destas e o que o stress pode causar ao estado de saúde de uma pessoa. Eles adequadamente compar-tiram a gratidão com toda a comunidade paroquial e eu próprio me sinto sinceramente grato a eles. A minha esperança é que eles os dois possam voltar às vidas que eles puseram de lado para nos ajudar no tempo de transição, e que eles saibam que a Igreja de S. Miguel será sempre a sua casa espiritual. Eu elevo as minhas orações por eles todas as manhãs, como também o faço por todos os paroquianos. Após a ascensão de Jesus ao Céu, os apóstolos também se encontraram na posição de terem de se ajustar a novas circunstâncias, mas isto por fim os guiou ao Pentecostes e ao anunciarem o Evangelho por todo o mundo. As épocas de transições ou mudanças são sempre tempos difíceis, mas elas nos apresentam novas oportunidades e novos desafios para vivermos as nossas vidas com uma mais profunda fé em Cristo.

Scripture Insights

Waiting in confident prayer is a theme in today's readings. In this Sunday between the Solemnities of the Ascension and Pentecost, we emulate the first disciples as they hoped for Jesus' promise of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

In the First Reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, we hear Stephen pray "Lord Jesus receive my prayer." Like Jesus, Stephen dies praying for forgiveness for his enemies; "Lord, do not hold this sin against them."

The Second Reading contains the final words of the Bible. John, who was entrusted with these visions, ends with a confident prayer by which he calls out: "Come, Lord Jesus." These words continue to echo as Christians pray with confidence the prayer the Lord taught us: "Thy Kingdom come."

On the eve of his death, Jesus prays with expectation for the unity of all his followers who are to come. He entrusts them, and we are included among them, to the care of his Father. The faith of future generations is transmitted through the witness of the lives of disciples. The unity for which Jesus prays is a unity with each other but more especially a unity with the Trinity: "So that they may all be one, as you father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us." The final hope of our confident prayer is to be united with one another in the happiness of our union with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

- ◆ How does Stephen's prayer echo that of Jesus' just before he died
- ◆ What do these two images in the second reading refer to: "Blessed are they *who wash their robes* so as to have the right to *the tree of life*"?
- ◆ How has your life been enriched by the Spirit as you wait in confident prayer.

NUTRITION

Healthy Plate

This pictorial replaced the Food Pyramid in 2011 to assist people to eat healthy

The Plate is divided into four wedges to represent the basic food groups –fruits, vegetables, grains and proteins.

Next to the plate is a cup standing in for the dairy group.

Basically a "balanced" and nutritious meal using the "plate method" for planning food portions is as follows"

- ◆ 50 percent as assorted vegetables (both green and red)
- ◆ 25 percent as protein (e.g. poultry, fish, beans)
- ◆ 25 percent as whole grains (e.g., brown rice)
- ◆ Fruit

Food Groups and Healthy Nutrition: USDA Recommendations

- ◆ Focus on fruits and vegetables
- ◆ Go for low-fat dairy
- ◆ Choose whole grains
- ◆ Avoid trans and saturated fats and limit sodium (salt) and sugars. Fat should only comprise about 20 to 35 percent of calorie intake.
- ◆ Choose lean proteins. About 15 percent of your total calories should come from proteins, such as skinless poultry, fish, beans, nuts and lean meats.

Small Steps to Better Nutrition and Health:

- ◆ Don't skip meals
- ◆ Drink a glass of water before meals and drink plenty of water throughout the day
- ◆ Use smaller plates (= smaller portions)
- ◆ Healthy choices – replace processed food with "real" food. Try to avoid packaged/processed foods and opt for more fresh ingredients.
- ◆ Vary your food choices to make sure you get a wide variety of nutrients and to avoid boredom.
- ◆ Read food packaging labels.
- ◆ Moderation, moderation, moderation


