Reform, Renewal, and Repentance (Part III) . . .

The Great Western Schism that rocked the Church in the twenty-five years bridging the turn of the fifteenth century made the need for Church reform painfully obvious. From the early fourteenth century the urge for such a purification had begun to take shape as a call for the "reform of head and members"—meaning a renewal of both the Pope and the Vatican on the one hand, and of the average layperson on the other. It was universally acknowledged that a conversion to greater holiness was achingly required of all the Faithful, regardless of rank or vocation. Over the course of the next two and a half centuries this phrase "Reform of head and members" would crescendo into a clarion call.

The push for the reform of the members, in fact, was already well under way. Grassroots efforts to reignite the fire of sanctity in the life of the average Christian (all of who, at this point in history, would still have been Catholic) had begun at virtually the same time as the scandal of the Western Schism, running as a parallel track in the current of the Church. Religious communities and orders began examining their own spirituality and piety, and responded to what they found in themselves with a program of purification and simplification—returning to living their vow of poverty in earnest. In the 1380's, the Brethren of the Common Life was founded by a man who, in his own life, embodied the virtue of personal reform.

Gerard Groote was a man of affluence, social prominence, and luxury, who, after a radical religious conversion in 1374, abandoned his privilege to adopt a life of simplicity and deep spiritual renewal. He was ordained a deacon of the Dutch diocese of Utrecht, given permission to preach without restriction throughout the diocese (no, Jared, you cannot get this same concession!). The firebrand deacon proceeded to use the pulpit to push for the purification of laity and clergy alike. So great was Groote's influence—or rather, so deep-seated was the common yearning for holiness—that his disciples began to form spontaneous cells of communal life dedicated to just this sort of life of austere sanctity. These would be comparable to what today we might call "intentional communities." These new communes supported themselves by simple, hard labor that served to hold body and soul together so they could fulfill their true purpose: personal repentance and an ever-deepening conversion of heart to Christ.

The spirituality that eventually blossomed out of Groote's preaching came to be known as the *Devotio Moderna*. It's most famous and enduring contribution to us is a little book attributed to Thomas a Kempis called *The Imitation of Christ*—a classic of Christian spirituality that's still read by many today. This book's over-riding theme wonderfully captures the main thrust of the *Devotio Moderna*: that obedience to the will of God, poverty (of spirit, as well as material poverty), humility, and patience in suffering are the paths to intimacy with Christ. The *Devotio Moderna* began to re-kindle a thirst for God and to make the quest for personal holiness popular again. The renewal of the Church in Her members had begun in earnest—and more than 100 years before Martin Luther was even born! (... To be continued ...)

Reforma, Renovação e Arrependimento (Parte III) . . .

O Grande Cisma do Ocidente que abalou a Igreja nos vinte e cinco anos da virada do século XV tornou dolorosamente óbvia a necessidade de uma reforma na Igreja. A partir do início do século XIV, o desejo por tal purificação começou a tomar forma como um apelo à "reforma da cabeça e dos membros" – significando uma renovação tanto do Papa como no Vaticano, por um lado, e a dos leigos, por outro. Era universalmente reconhecido que uma conversão para uma maior santidade era dolorosamente exigida de todos os fiéis, independentemente da posição ou vocação. Ao longo dos próximos dois séculos e meio esta frase "Reforma da cabeça e membros" cresceria em um toque de clarim.

A pressão pela reforma dos membros, de facto, já estava bem encaminhada. Esforços de base para reacender o fogo da santidade na vida da classe cristã (todos os quais, neste ponto da história, ainda seriam católicos) começaram praticamente ao mesmo tempo que o escândalo do Cisma Ocidental, correndo como uma pista paralela na corrente da Igreja. Comunidades e ordens religiosas começaram a examinar a sua própria espiritualidade e piedade, e responderam ao que encontraram em si mesmas com um programa de purificação e simplificação – voltando a viver seu o voto de pobreza com seriedade. Na década de 1380, os Irmãos da Vida Comum foram fundados por um homem que, em sua própria vida, incorporou a virtude da reforma pessoal.

Gerard Groote foi um homem de riqueza, destaque social e luxo, que, após uma conversão religiosa radical em 1374, abandonou a sua vida de privilégio para adotar uma vida de simplicidade e profunda renovação espiritual. Ele foi ordenado diácono da diocese holandesa de Utrecht, recebeu permissão para pregar sem restrições em toda a diocese (não, Jared, você não pode obter essa mesma concessão!). O diácono incendiário passou a usar o púlpito para promover à purificação os leigos e clérigos ao mesmo tempo. Tão grande foi a influência de Groote - ou melhor, tão profundo era o anseio comum por santidade - que os seus discípulos começaram a formar células espontâneas de vida comunal dedicadas exatamente a esse tipo de vida de santidade austera. Estes seriam comparáveis ao que hoje podemos chamar de "comunidades intencionais". Essas novas comunas se sustentavam com um trabalho simples e árduo que servia para manter o corpo e a alma unidos para que pudessem cumprir o seu verdadeiro propósito: arrependimento pessoal e uma conversão cada vez mais profunda e sincera a Cristo.

A espiritualidade que eventualmente floresceu da pregação de Groote veio a ser conhecida como a Devotio Moderna. A sua contribuição mais famosa e duradoura para nós é um pequeno livro atribuído a Thomas a Kempis chamado A Imitação de Cristo – um clássico da espiritualidade cristã que ainda é lido por muitos hoje. O tema principal deste livro captura maravilhosamente o principal impulso da Devotio Moderna: que a obediência à vontade de Deus, a pobreza (de espírito, bem como a pobreza material), humildade e paciência no sofrimento são os caminhos para a intimidade com Cristo. A Devotio Moderna começou a reacender a sede por Deus e a tornar popular novamente a busca da santidade pessoal. A renovação da Igreja em Seus membros havia começado a sério - e mais de 100 anos antes de Martinho Lutero nascer!
