Happy 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time!

I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

Jesus concluding the Parable of the Persistent Neighbor, Luke 11:8

On Persistence

In Luke, Jesus' disciples ask him how to pray, and he gives them a list of things a good prayer should contain: recognize God's supremacy, a request for our minimal sustenance, forgiveness of our sins, a recognition that we must forgive others and a plea for mercy. Lastly, he tells a parable of being persistent in prayer.

I think that we often misinterpret Jesus' comment that "whoever asks, receives." Jesus' example is a man who goes to a neighbor in the middle of the night asking to borrow bread to feed unexpected guests. Now, the man is not asking for a fatted calf. Nor is he asking to be given the bread; he is willing to pay the neighbor back. Like the plea for daily bread, it's a modest ask. Or, to paraphrase Keith Jaeger, you aren't always given what you want but you are given what you need.

In the Genesis story, God is really upset with the people of Sodom and is intent on destroying the city. Abraham dares to argue with God, asking not once but six times for mercy on the entire city for the sake of a smaller and smaller number of the virtuous.

But God ends up destroying Sodom. How did Abraham feel about that? Genesis is silent on the matter but I personally expect he was very angry with God. He might have accused God of knowing all along that there weren't ten just people in Sodom. I can imagine God giving Abraham the reply God would later give to Job in 125 verses: I am God. You really can't understand what I'm about or where my decisions will lead to.

We have revised our reporting on collections to include only ordinary collections and holy day collections. Our prior reporting used ordinary income, which includes the ACA and Called to Serve rebate.

St. Therese has a hearing loop!

What is a HEARING LOOP?

A supplemental sound system that connects our church sound board wirelessly to assistive hearing devices.

How does a **HEARING LOOP** deliver greater sound quality to more people? It's actually quite simple!

The sound source is captured using microphones throughout the church.

The microphones create sound signals that connect to an amplifier which passes the signal to the hearing loop.


The hearing loop surrounds the entire sanctuary and carries the sound signal through the loop.

The sound signal is picked up by the tcoil (telecoil) enabled hearing aids, cochlear implants, or headsets with loop receivers worn by congregants with hearing deficiencies.


Each individual who uses cochlear implants or wears hearing aids equipped with a t-coil can change a program and tailor the sound to eliminate background noise and enhance the full spectrum of sound for intelligibility. There is no need to use a separate receiver.

The UNIVERSAL SYMBOL is displayed at venues with a HEARING LOOP, participants with hearing aids or cochlear implants to turn on their t-coils.

If parishioners or visitors do not have t-coil equipped hearing aids or cochlear implants, the UNIVERSAL SYMBOL alerts them to request a headset available at either entrance to the church.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR NATIONAL CEO AND THE EXAMPLE OF BELOVED PAUL McCARTNEY



In his recent message to all Vincentians, our servant leader commences by saying "Sir Paul is touring again this year. In a few days he will turn 80 years, but he still takes on the grind of travel to different cities and several hours of concert performing." Dave Barringer is a real fan of Sir Paul, having attended several of his concerts and mentioning that the sound is better than ever because of digital technology. But why is the above statement of importance to us? As Dave states, "There is something special about being in the same room even if that room holds 50,000 others." And as Dave notes, "Imagine if Christ had not appeared in person to the Apostles in a locked room after his crucifixion but instead sent a messenger, or since all is in his power some sort of a recorded message.... After their shock subsided a bit, we know that the Apostles listened and then remembered Christ's words and image for the rest of their lives. They then spread his message and their personal encounter around the known world."

We at St. V have been known as unique among charities for our home visits. Because of the pandemic period, we have had to curtail these visits and rely heavily on telephone calls, Zoom or other methods, but this is not intended to be permanent. In addition, like other conferences in Seattle/King County, our St. Therese Conference has made personal presence still a feature of our mission. Examples are giving food and household goods vouchers to neighbors at our front doors, dropping off food or other goods to the neighbors at the outside of their homes, and bringing donated food to food banks. Of course, any of these activities are performed with masks or other health precautions strictly observed.

If you would like to continue to assist us, especially in helping with rent to avoid homelessness, you can do so by contributing on Sunday, at the north and south entrances of the church and on our collection day, the third Sunday of the month.
