

THE BEAUTIFUL STORY OF THE FOUNDING OF THE SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT de PAUL



This beautiful story of the founding of our Society of St. Vincent de Paul is good to reflect upon because it is an inspiration for our work, and the generosity of the support of you parishioners. September 27 was the feast day of the wonderful St. Vincent de Paul whose life inspired the formation of The Society of St. Vincent de Paul. The feast day of our founder Blessed Frederic Ozanam was September 9. In 1832 an epidemic of cholera swept through Paris, killing up to 1200 people a day. Large slums were forming in Paris; thousands of people lived without work, some without clothes, and many were alcoholics. Homelessness, disease, and starvation were common. Factories were closed due to a revolution. As a 22-year-old gifted student Blessed Frederic walked through the poor suburbs on his way to university lectures, he was deeply moved. On April 23, 1833, he gathered a few friends around him to decide what they could do for the poor. These young men attracted the comment "What can seven young men hope to achieve in alleviating the suffering in Paris." And this is what happened: Frederic and his various friends went through the slums of Paris delivering food, wood for stoves, and other needs of the poor. This was the birth of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul named after the Patron Saint of Christian charity. It is also important to note the work of Sister Rosalie Rendu - a Daughter of Charity - who was working with the poor - in the choosing of the name and in introducing the young men to people they could assist.

Paris is still headquarters, but we are in 142 countries on 5 continents. Our smallest organizational group is the parish conference, which is what we have at St. Therese.

If you would like to continue to assist us, especially in helping with rents to avoid homelessness, you can do so by contributing, at the north and south entrances of the church and on our collection day, the third Sunday of the month. 
A Social Justice Commission Recommended Event Advancing Racial Equity with LaTosha Brown
