


#### 2022-2023 Annual financial report now available at church doors.

In a few weeks we will begin the Stewardship of Treasure campaign where we ask you to make financial pledges in support of St. Therese.

But. as we begin that campaign, we want to report to you on our stewardship of what you have already given. We cannot ask you to be stewards without showing you that we have been good stewards ourselves.

The annual financial report for the fiscal year that ended in June is available at the church entrance. It will show you in some detail where our funds came from and how we spent them. As usual, most went to people – our pastor, staff, music directors, musicians.

Another big contribution was to the school. St. Therese Catholic Academy is the largest social justice activity of the parish and it is important that we support the school as best we can. Currently we contribute 12 percent of the three-year average of Sunday giving to the school, or \$55,000.



The report includes the school's income and spending. The school is a good steward of its financial resources as well.

There is good news in the report. The parish ended the year with a small surplus of about \$15,000. It meant that we did not have to tap into savings to cover a deficit. The school had a surplus as well despite it being a year of transition.

The report includes St. Mary's, the former parish which was merged into St. Therese at the beginning year. A group of St. Mary parishioners has appealed the closure of their parish to the Vatican, but we have heard nothing from the Vatican as yet on that appeal, and until we do we must keep separate accounts for St. Mary's income and assets.

Our budget for the current fiscal year – we are already a third of the way through it – is conservative. We have budgeted a deficit of about \$5,000, thinking that we could work to reduce that over the year. In fact through August we have a surplus of about \$10,000 thanks in part to a generous bequest from the estate of longtime parishioner George Kenny.

As always, we want to say thank you. Thank you to the Kenny family. Thank you to those who write a check each week. Thank you to those who contribute on line. Thanks to those who put in a few dollars in cash. Thank you to those who simply pray for us. You are all important and an important part of keeping our parish strong.

One of the themes of the report is change. Change is happening again as we move toward a new "family" structure with St. Joseph's through the Archdiocese Partners in the Gospel consolidation. We continue to work with the Archdiocese and other experts to understand how the changes will affect us.

SEATTLE — As the Archdiocese of Seattle nears the end of the public consultation phase of Partners in the Gospel, it is encouraging Catholics to join in the discussion.

Over the past weeks, parishes around the archdiocese have hosted listening sessions as part of the public consultation phase — a time for the public to offer input on proposed parish families and the changes that could come as the archdiocese's strategic planning initiative moves forward.

"We sincerely want to know from you, how does this sound? What are the hopes, the anxieties, the concerns that you see?" Archbishop Paul D. Etienne said in a video shared with parishes Sept. 23-24. "How is the Lord inviting us as a people of faith in him to rise to this moment and challenge that it presents?"

Those are exactly the kinds of discussions people are having in their listening sessions, participants say.

Participants said being open and respectful and recognizing the gifts, talents and histories of each parish also was a hallmark of their discussions. Input can be submitted online at archseattle.org/partners.

So what's being done with all the comments from the listening sessions? What if participants have concerns about the makeup of their parish family? Each listening session has notetakers from within the parish who are documenting the feedback. Those notes are being sent to the archdiocese, where they will be reviewed by two people along with all the online comments. The readers assigned to a parish family will then create a synthesis of all the feedback that will be shared with the archdiocese's Oversight Committee and its Presbyteral Council for discernment before a final recommendation is given to Archbishop Etienne.

As of Oct. 11, 350 forms from nearly 100 parishes have been turned in, and more than 560 comments have been submitted online through the Partners in the Gospel website, the archdiocese said.

Reflection from the Principal

Little Things With Great Love

from September 29th

Today we honored our Patron Saint, St. Therese of Lisieux. Although her feast day was, October 1st, as a school community we felt it was still important to have our Mass dedicated to her today. The students brought roses to honor her because St. Therese once wrote "When I die, I will send down a shower of roses from the heavens, I will spend my heaven by doing good on earth." Her mantra was to do little things with great love. At St. Therese Catholic Academy, our goal is to consistently preach that with not only our words but with our actions.

As we look to follow St. Therese as an example, today we also asked for the intercession of our own more recent hopeful saints of the Future. Today in the St. Therese school community was the feast of Wayne Melonson. Wayne James Melonson (10/6/1950 – 12/9/2017) was a born teacher, who had a passion for Catholic education, a passion for opening young minds to the wonders of learning, and a passion for justice. He was a huge inspiration to every student he taught and every teacher he mentored. He wanted his students and mentees not just to learn, but to grow; he wanted them to think for themselves and to question. He wanted them to open their eyes to untried possibilities, and to push beyond boundaries. He wanted each of them to fulfill their God-given potential whatever it was, and he wanted them to know where that potential came from, God. That's what made Wayne not just a great educator, but a deeply Christian one.



Wayne spent 61 years as an active participant in the St. Therese parish, first as a student at the school, then as the teen club moderator and a coach, and finally in a professional capacity for 24 years as a teacher, Vice Principal, and Principal. When he returned from retirement to St. Therese, he was a mentor of Mr. DeBoer and me. He served humbly, he served faithfully, and he did everything in his power to make this world a better place, a brighter place, and a more just and caring place. I think we all agree he did this extraordinarily well! So in honor of Wayne, our students all wore purple, which was his favorite color.

On this day, I couldn't think of two better examples of past and more recent present, representations of Christ love shown to others by their actions. God taught us that each one of us is special, and that the hairs on our head are numbered. Knowing that we have such greatness instilled in us, let us emulate our role models who came before us, and prepare the way for a future filled with hope.
