

Reflection from the Principal

Welcoming Advent December 8th

Week 1 of Advent is about Hope. There is so much to be hopeful for and these past few weeks post-Thanksgiving have continued to be a reminder for us all. Last night, our community celebrated our Christmas Concert after a few years of virtual celebrations. It was very joyful in the church and the smiles on everyone's faces is a reminder of the hope for a better tomorrow.

This week, our community began our annual Advent morning prayer service, where we highlight the story of Jesus' arrival. We break open the Word of God and dive into the stories of those chosen by God to help usher in the Lord's arrival. Today, we began with Anne, the mother of Mary, as we celebrate the Immaculate Conception. We then turn to Mary and Joseph, who are chosen by God to be the parents of the Savior of the world.

As we combine our preparation for the Lord with all of those chosen by God to assist in our salvation, I couldn't help but root our students in what their own calling will be. Our theme this year is centered around each one of us being chosen by God. The hairs on our head are numbered and none of us are forgotten. The Bible is filled with stories of people answering God's call, and we hope to emulate those people in our lives.

As we center ourselves in the first week of Advent, let us keep Hope at the center of our hearts. Hope for the future that God has for us; Hope for those struggling in the world for their basic needs; Hope for the St. Therese community that we can be agents of change for the Kingdom of God.
