

THE WEEKLY WORD

A COLUMN WRITTEN BY A MEMBER OF OUR PARISH FAMILY



In this week's gospel, The Rich Man and Lazarus, Jesus's parable revisits the theme of reversal of fortune—Dives, the rich man, who fully enjoys his life of privilege while refusing to attend to the needs of Lazarus, a destitute man “covered with sores”, lying at his door tormented by scavenging dogs. In the afterlife, Dives is horrified to find himself condemned to an eternity of suffering, beyond the reach of mercy. A grim tale, to be sure, not reflecting well on dogs or humanity!

My father's family comes from Occitan, a region comprising southern France and parts of Italy, home to numerous saints and popes, including the Avignon Papacy. One of the best-known saints is Saint Roche, is better known as St. Rocco thanks to his miraculous cures during the 14th century plague before he himself fell victim to the illness. Catholic iconography depicts him as accompanied by a dog who tends to him in his isolation, bringing him bread and healing his wounds.

For me, the imagery of St. Roche and the scriptural rehabilitation of the dogs from ravenous, unclean outcasts to faithful companions is a useful example of the transformative power and mercy of the new Covenant. I am prompted to look beyond preconceptions, to show my vulnerability, and to accept love and support coming from unexpected places.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY



Donations help with heat in the cold-weather months. She had asked for some help with food. But as soon as we arrived, our St. Vincent de Paul volunteers could see that this neighbor needed some help with heat too.

Trying to survive on just about \$350 a month after rent left her without even the most basic necessities. She wore a heavy woolen coat that "A friend had given me." She needed a couple of blankets for her bed. This neighbor had not turned on the heat because her old apartment had electric baseboard heating, a very inefficient and expensive luxury for her. We provided her with Safeway cards for food, and got her some blankets.

We urged her to use the heaters at least during the day. She is well up in age and should not wreck her health by being in a cold apartment. We'll see her in another 90 days. Your donations allow us to help this woman and many like her who live at the edge of society. Thank you for your continuing generosity: it's the Lord's work.





Women's Ministry Fall Retreat






