

We Stand With Immigrants - A New Parish Family Group

The faith communities that make up our parish family each have long histories of putting faith into action, to serve those on the margins and to seek to live out the Gospel call to love our neighbor. This summer, that same spirit inspired a new conversation about how to stand with our immigrant brothers and sisters, a response to Jesus' call in the Gospels: "For I was a stranger and you welcomed me" (Mt 25:35). This is also an invitation we are hearing from Pope Leo and Archbishop Etienne, so there is energy in our church to stand with immigrants in these very difficult times when they are feeling extremely vulnerable and unjustly treated.

Monthly meetings are hosted at St. Therese between Masses, from 10 - 11 a.m. (please join for the next one on November 9). About a dozen folks regularly participate, though over 50 people from our parish family have been part of the dialogue at some point over the last 3 months.

The group has moved from initial summer conversation to faith-filled action, prayer, education and service this fall. A dozen of us participated in a public witness at the Federal Building on September 19 during lunch hour, holding up a St. Therese Parish banner and a second large banner from St. Joe's stating "We Stand With Immigrants." Another dozen attended the Archdiocesan "Immigration Summit" hosted at Seattle University on September 27.

Then a large group, perhaps 50 or so from our parish family, were involved in the Archdiocesan "Pilgrimage of Hope" on October 4, joining a public march 800 strong from St. Leo's in Tacoma to the nearby ICE Detention Center for an outdoor Mass. Two weeks later, on October 18 as part of No Kings Day, we marched again under the banner "People of Faith Stand With Immigrants" inviting people from local faith communities to join us, including other Catholic parishes, Lutheran congregations, the Plymouth Congregational Church, and even a Zen Buddhist Temple on Beacon Hill. And on the evening of October 22 at St. Joseph's we prayed the rosary in solidarity with our immigrant brothers and sisters in detention at the ICE Detention Center in Tacoma.

We welcome you to join us and express your faith in such a meaningful way!

On Thursday Nov. 13th, from 4-5 in front of the Federal Building at 915 2nd Ave, join us as we sing and pray for hope and light in these times (see bulletin flyer for more details).

And as we move into the holiday season, please consider participating in an upcoming drive for clothing, toiletries and food needs for immigrants (keep your eye out for more information!). Join us with your prayer, participation, and generosity in expressing our faith as a parish family and saying clearly that We Stand With Immigrants in this momentous time! SISTER PARISH UPDATE



2025 Walk-a-Long for San Bartolome a Success

Sunday September 28 was the annual Walk-a-long to benefit our sister parish San Bartolome in El Salvador. In what is a decades-long tradition about 20 people walked from St Joe's to Volunteer Park and back. The walk commemorates Salvadorans walking from refugee camps in Honduras to repopulate Nueva Trinidad. Our group stopped at the water tower in Volunteer Park to recall the community water projects that we have supported over the years. Over \$3,000 was raised to support senior nutrition and social support, as well as internet and electricity for the community center used by many students in the area. Thanks to all who walked and who so generously donated.

We recently received the following message from El Salvador:

It is always a true pleasure for us to receive news from you and to know that you continue with spirit and enthusiasm working for living church of solidarity. We always pray for you and hold you deeply in our hearts. We are very glad to feel part of your community, your liturgy, and your prayers.

Thank you for carrying the memory of our return to our country as the people of God liberated from the slavery of Egypt and arriving in the land of freedom; leaving the exile of Honduras and returning to our homeland.


