Dedication of The Lateran Basilica - November 9th

Originally founded in 324, the Archbasilica of Saint John Lateran is the oldest and highest ranking of the four papal major basilicas, holding the unique title of "archbasilica." It is the oldest public church in the city of Rome, and the oldest basilica of the Western world. It houses the cathedra of the Roman bishop, the Pope, and has the title of Ecumenical Mother Church of the Roman Catholic Faithful. The building deteriorated during the Middle Ages and was badly damaged by two fires in the 14th century. It was rebuilt in the late 16th century during the reign of Pope Sixtus V. The new structure's interior was renovated in the late 17th century, and its façade was completed in 1735 under Pope Clement XII. The anniversary of the dedication of this church has been observed as a feast in Roman Catholicism only since the 12th century, a time of increasing centralization of papal authority in the history of the Church. In the General Roman Calendar of the Catholic Church, 9 November is the feast of the Dedication of the (Arch)Basilica of the Lateran. In view of its role as the mother church of the world, this liturgical day is ranked worldwide as a feast.


