OUR CHRISTMAS MASSES

Thank you for the more than 150 responses to our Christmas Mass survey to gather information about your plans this year!

We will be celebrating our three Christmas Masses at their traditional times — 5 p.m. and 10 p.m. on Christmas Eve, and 10 a.m. on Christmas Day. Based on your survey responses and your willingness to worship in the Parish Center, **the 5 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass will include overflow to the Parish Center**, where Mass will be live-streamed on the projection screen. Eucharistic ministers will distribute communion there.

Reservations for our Christmas Masses will become available on Monday, **Nov. 16, at 9 a.m.** The signups for the three Masses will be at the same Signup Genius link as all of our other weekend and holiday Masses. The link is available on our website or by going directly to <https://www.signupgenius.com/go/9040848afaa2daafa7-sunday1>.

You also have the option to call **Mary Regan** at 314-481-1133, #2, to make a reservation.

IMPORTANT: SIGNING UP ONLINE

Because there are several weeks' worth of Masses included in our Signup Genius, **please check dates and times carefully. Be sure you are signing up for the Mass you intend to sign up for.**

If you are signing up for our 5 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass, your first available option (as a **Congregant**) will have you seated in the church building. If those available **Congregant** slots fill up, you will then have the option to sign up in the **Worship in Parish Center** category. If that category should fill up as well, and if you are not available to attend Mass at one of the other two times, we ask that you sign up in the **Waiting List** category. If slots become available, we will contact you. Based on our survey responses, our current options will accommodate all who are interested in attending.

THE FABLE OF THE BIRDS

There is a legend that after God had created all of the animals of the wood, the newly-made animals walked around, happily discovering what it was like to be alive and getting used to their new bodies — all except the birds.

While the other animals had legs so they could run or fins so that they could swim, the birds could just hop a few steps. They didn't know what to do with these awkward appendages on their shoulder. *Why has God punished us?* they wondered. *Why do we have struggle to get around with these "things" on our backs?*

But then one bird managed to move those "things" on its back and discovered by flapping them up and down the bird could lift itself off the ground higher and higher and higher into the air. Then another bird began to flap its appendages. And then another and another and another. The birds discovered that they could soar into the skies — something no other animal could do.

The birds discovered that what they thought was a "heavy burden" was actually a wonderful gift from God.

Whether we believe it or not, each one of us has been given something unique and special from God that we can use to contribute to the work of creation. Sometimes the very "thing" that we consider to be a burden or disadvantage leads us to discover the particular gift we (or another person) possesses. But, as Jesus teaches in the parable of the talents, such grace demands work on our part, the faith to "flap our wings," and a willingness to place our "wings" at the service of others. Our greatness lies not in the greatness of our talents in themselves but in the greatness of our love to use them to build the Kingdom of God in our time and place.

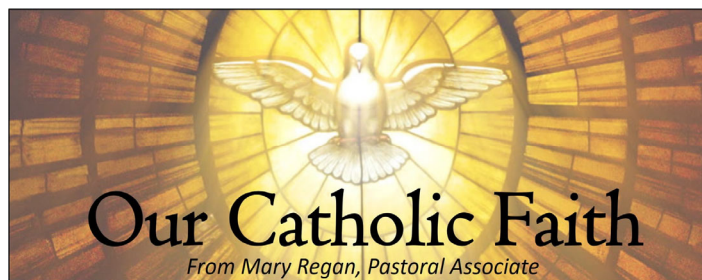

Are the Bible and the Lectionary the same thing?

No, they are not the same. I will spend more time on the subject of the Bible and Lectionary individually in future editions of *Our Catholic Faith*.

The Bible can be thought of as a library of books. Very briefly, the books contained in the Old Testament (or Hebrew Scriptures) are a written record of the faith journey of the Jewish people. The New Testament (or Christian Scriptures) is the story of Jesus, his teachings, and the Church's first years of life.

The Lectionary is used at Mass and contains a collection of readings from the Bible. It contains specific readings from the Hebrew Scriptures and from the Christian Scriptures. The Lectionary follows a three-year cycle, with each year highlighting one of the synoptic Gospels as well as parts of John's Gospel.

Thanksgiving Collection 2020

Thanksgiving week has always been an important time for our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society. We could always count on raising a significant portion of our operating expenses during this time because of the faithful generosity of our parishioners. Coupled with the ongoing support from various groups throughout the year, especially our **Holy Name Society**, we have been able to continue to help our **Neighbors In Need** who live within our parish boundaries with utilities, household furnishings, rent, clothes, and food.

The virus has certainly changed our manner of contacting the people we work with, both in their homes and at the Food Pantry. The overall needs have certainly grown substantially, as everyone knows, but we have been able to offer at least some help to almost everyone who has asked for it. During our fiscal year (October 2019-September 2020) we provided monetary assistance to our neighbors-in-need in the amount of **\$62,081.21**. (Last year it was \$43,011.92.)

We do not foresee any lessening of requests for help in this coming year. In fact, we anticipate the need will grow for the foreseeable future. We are hopeful of your continued support with this year's Thanksgiving collection, future **5th Sunday** collections, the Parish Memorial Fund Program, as well as your individual gifts, words of encouragement, and prayers so we can continue to meet the needs of our neighbors.

In previous years you would have received a SVDP Thanksgiving flyer with an attached contribution envelope to put in the special Thanksgiving Weekend collection. This year we are simply asking you to put any donation in the Thanksgiving Mass collection basket. You are also welcome to put it in an envelope marked "SVDP" at a different Mass, send it to the parish office, or contribute via SSP Online Giving. Any non-perishable food items can be placed on the sanctuary steps at the Thanksgiving Day liturgy.

PLEASE NOTE that at the weekend Masses after Thanksgiving Day (Nov. 28-29), we will be having our regular **5th Sunday Food Pantry Collection**. A truck will be on the Bell Tower Lot from 3:30 p.m.-4:00 p.m. on Saturday and from 8:30 a.m.-9:00 a.m. on Sunday.

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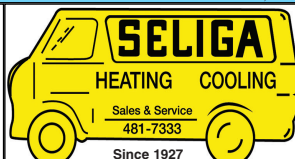
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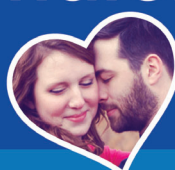
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
